<u>asteroid</u>	A small rocky body orbiting the sun. Large numbers of these, ranging enormously in size, are found between the orbits of Mars and Jupiter, though some have more eccentric orbits.
<u>astronaut</u>	A person trained to travel in a spacecraft. The Russians called their astronaut s cosmonauts.
ball	Form into a ball by winding or rolling. They had to carry a ramrod as well as powder and ball .
<u>comet</u>	A relatively small extraterrestrial body consisting of a frozen mass that travels around the sun in a highly elliptical orbit.
<u>cosmic</u>	Inconceivably extended in space or time. The song is a masterpiece of cosmic proportions.
diameter	A straight line connecting the center of a circle with two points on its perimeter (or the center of a sphere with two points on its surface.
epicycle	An epicycle used to describe planetary orbits in the Ptolemaic system.
globe	Form something into a globe. Orange trees clipped into giant globe s.
globular	Globe-shaped; spherical. Little globular houses like mud wasp nests.
hemisphere	A half of the earth, usually as divided into northern and southern halves by the equator, or into western and eastern halves by an imaginary line passing through the poles. <i>The left hemisphere plays a dominant role in the comprehension of language.</i>
jupiter	The largest planet and the 5th from the sun; has many satellites and is one of the brightest objects in the night sky.



lunar	Of or relating to or associated with the moon. A lunar landscape.
mantle	Cover like a mantle. <i>Mantle rock</i> .
mars	A small reddish planet that is the 4th from the sun and is periodically visible to the naked eye; minerals rich in iron cover its surface and are responsible for its characteristic color.
meteor	A streak of light in the sky at night that results when a meteoroid hits the earth s atmosphere and air friction causes the meteoroid to melt or vaporize or explode.
neptune	(Roman mythology) god of the sea; counterpart of Greek Poseidon.
<u>orbit</u>	Of a celestial object or spacecraft move in orbit round a star or planet. The satellite will complete one orbit every 12 hours.
<u>planet</u>	Astronomy any of the nine large celestial bodies in the solar system that revolve around the sun and shine by reflected light Mercury Venus Earth Mars Jupiter Saturn Uranus Neptune and Pluto in order of their proximity to the sun viewed from the constellation Hercules all the planets rotate around the sun in a counterclockwise direction. The planets are presently influencing you in a positive way.
pluto	The god of the underworld in ancient mythology; brother of Zeus and husband of Persephone.
satellite	Broadcast or disseminate via satellite. A city and its satellite communities.
saturn	(Roman mythology) god of agriculture and vegetation; counterpart of Greek Cronus.
spacecraft	A vehicle used for travelling in space.
sphericity	The roundness of a 3-dimensional object.
straightforwardness	Without hypocrisy. What some people take for rudeness is really straightforwardness .
tropic	Either of two parallels of latitude about 23 5 degrees to the north and south of the equator representing the points farthest north and south at which the sun can shine directly overhead and constituting the boundaries of the Torrid Zone or tropics. <i>Tropical islands.</i>



<u>universe</u>	All existing matter and space considered as a whole the cosmos The universe is believed to be at least 10 billion light years in diameter and contains a vast number of galaxies it has been expanding since its creation in the Big Bang about 13 billion years ago. <i>They study the evolution of the universe</i> .
uranus	(Greek mythology) god of the heavens; son and husband of Gaea and father of the Titans in ancient mythology.
venus	Type genus of the family Veneridae: genus of edible clams with thick oval shells.
world	All of the living human inhabitants of the earth. The animal world .
worldwide	Of worldwide scope or applicability Christopher Morley. <i>She travels worldwide as a consultant.</i>
