animation	The state of being full of life or vigour; liveliness. <i>A combination of live action with 3 D animation.</i>
breeziness	A mildly windy state of the air. <i>A delightful breeziness of manner.</i>
buoyancy	A cheerful and optimistic attitude or disposition. <i>I admired his buoyancy and persistent good humor.</i>
cheerfulness	The quality of causing happiness. <i>The overall cheerfulness of the film.</i>

effervescence	Vivacity and enthusiasm. <i>The effervescence of sparkling wine.</i>
elation	An exhilarating psychological state of pride and optimism; an absence of depression. <i>Richard's elation at regaining his health was short lived.</i>
enthusiasm	Something that arouses enthusiasm. <i>The three enthusiasms of his life were politics religion and books.</i>
euphoria	A feeling of great (usually exaggerated) elation. <i>In his euphoria he had become convinced he could defeat them.</i>
exhilaration	A feeling of excitement, happiness, or elation. <i>They felt the exhilaration of victory.</i>
exuberance	The quality of growing profusely; luxuriance. <i>A sense of youthful exuberance.</i>
gladness	Experiencing joy and pleasure.
high spirits	A forward gear with a gear ratio that gives the greatest vehicle velocity for a given engine speed.
high-spiritedness	Exuberant liveliness.
irrepressibility	Irrepressible liveliness and good spirit.
jauntiness	Stylishness as evidenced by a smart appearance.
jollity	Lively and cheerful activity or celebration. <i>He was full of false jollity.</i>
joy	A thing that causes joy. <i>A joy to behold.</i>
joyfulness	The emotion of great happiness.
jubilation	A feeling of extreme joy. <i>Unbelievable scenes of jubilation.</i>
merriment	Activities that are enjoyable or amusing. <i>Her eyes sparkled with merriment.</i>
perkiness	Cheerfulness that bubbles to the surface.
sparkle	A glittering flash of light. <i>She's got a kind of sparkle.</i>
sunniness	The quality of being cheerful and dispelling gloom.
vivacity	Characterized by high spirits and animation. <i>He was struck by her vivacity humour and charm.</i>
zest	The outer coloured part of the peel of citrus fruit, used as flavouring. <i>They campaigned with zest and intelligence.</i>

gutsy	Marked by courage and determination in the face of difficulties or danger; robust and uninhibited-Judith Crist. <i>A smooth Bordeaux that is gutsy enough to accompany steak.</i>
live	Lead a certain kind of life live in a certain style. <i>Only the name lived on.</i>
lively	Full of spirit. <i>A lively tennis ball.</i>
luxuriant	Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses. <i>Forests of dark luxuriant foliage.</i>

overweening	Showing excessive confidence or pride. <i>Overweening ambition.</i>
pert	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>A pert slightly plump girl called Rose.</i>
plucky	Showing courage. <i>The plucky youngster has astounded medical staff.</i>
praise	Offering words of homage as an act of worship. <i>They sang a hymn of praise to God.</i>
saucy	Sexually suggestive in a light-hearted and humorous way. <i>The beret was perched at a saucy angle on her blonde hair.</i>
spirited	Made lively or spirited. <i>A warm hearted generous spirited man.</i>
sprightly	Full of spirit and vitality. <i>A sprightly dance.</i>
superbly	Extremely well. <i>The tomb is superbly ornamented with fine tracery.</i>
vibrant	(of colour) bright and striking. <i>The men s vibrant voices.</i>
vital	Absolutely necessary; essential. <i>A beautiful vital girl.</i>
vivacious	Vigorous and animated. <i>Her vivacious and elegant mother.</i>
vivid	Having striking color. <i>A vivid description.</i>
wonderfully	In a way that inspires delight or admiration; extremely well. <i>Wonderfully crafted songs.</i>
zesty	Marked by spirited enjoyment.
