buoyant	Characterized by liveliness and lightheartedness. Car sales were <b>buoyant</b> .
<u>cheerful</u>	Noticeably happy and optimistic. The room was painted in <b>cheerful</b> colours.



cheery	Happy and optimistic. A <b>cheery</b> hello.
<u>effervescent</u>	(of a liquid) giving off bubbles. His fertile <b>effervescent</b> mind.
elated	Exultantly proud and joyful; in high spirits. Dozens of <b>elated</b> fans welcomed the champions home.
enthusiastic	Having or showing intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval. <i>Was enthusiastic about taking ballet lessons.</i>
<u>euphoric</u>	Exaggerated feeling of well-being or elation. A <b>euphoric</b> sense of freedom.
exhilarated	Very happy, animated, or elated. The sun and the wind on his back made him feel <b>exhilarated</b> happy to be alive.
exuberant	Produced or growing in extreme abundance. A noisy bunch of <b>exuberant</b> youngsters.
high-spirited	Joyously unrestrained.
in high spirits	Currently fashionable.
irrepressible	Impossible to repress or control. An <b>irrepressible</b> rogue.
jaunty	Having or expressing a lively, cheerful, and self-confident manner. <i>A <b>jaunty</b> red hat.</i>
<u>joyful</u>	Feeling, expressing, or causing great pleasure and happiness. A <b>joyful</b> heart.
jubilant	Feeling or expressing great happiness and triumph. A large number of <b>jubilant</b> fans ran on to the pitch.
light-hearted	Carefree and happy and lighthearted.
<u>merry</u>	(of an occasion or season) characterized by festivity and enjoyment. <i>He wished me a <b>merry</b> Christmas.</i>
<u>sparkling</u>	Shining brightly with flashes of light. <i>Sparkling</i> water.
<u>sunny</u>	(of a place) receiving much sunlight. A <b>sunny</b> day.
<u>vivacious</u>	Vigorous and animated. A <b>vivacious</b> folk dance.

active	An active form of a verb. An <b>active</b> bond market.
alive	Capable of erupting. He was kept <b>alive</b> by a feeding tube.
animated	Full of life or excitement; lively. An <b>animated</b> version of the classic fairy tale.
<u>animation</u>	The condition of living or the state of being alive. <b>Animation</b> s as backdrops for live action.
boisterous	Violently agitated and turbulent- Ezra Pound. <b>Boisterous</b> winds and waves.
bouncing	Rebounding from an impact (or series of impacts. <i>A <b>bouncing</b> baby.</i>
<u>bouncy</u>	Elastic; rebounds readily. <b>Bouncy</b> 1960s tunes.
cheerily	In a happy and optimistic way. <i>He chats <b>cheerily</b> about city living.</i>
exuberant	Full of energy, excitement, and cheerfulness. <i>Exuberant foliage</i> .
<u>feisty</u>	Touchy and aggressive. The champion is faced with a <b>feisty</b> challenger.
gutsy	Greedy. The <b>gutsy</b> intensity of her musical involvement.
live	Continue to live through hardship or adversity. Got a shock from a <b>live</b> wire.
lively	Elastic; rebounds readily. A <b>lively</b> period in history.
luxuriant	Marked by complexity and richness of detail. Forests of dark <b>luxuriant</b> foliage.



overweening	Presumptuously arrogant- S.V.Benet- NY Times. Had a witty but <b>overweening</b> manner.
pert	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. She had a <b>pert</b> nose and deep blue eyes.
plucky	Having or showing determined courage in the face of difficulties. The <b>plucky</b> youngster has astounded medical staff.
praise	Express approval of. We <b>praise</b> God for past blessings.
<u>saucy</u>	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>Saucy postcards</i> .
<u>spirited</u>	Made lively or spirited. A <b>spirited</b> dance.
sprightly	Full of spirit and vitality. She was quite <b>sprightly</b> for her age.
superbly	In an impressively splendid manner. The team played <b>superbly</b> .
<u>vibrant</u>	Vigorous and animated. A <b>vibrant</b> cosmopolitan city.
<u>vital</u>	Full of spirit. Secrecy is of <b>vital</b> importance.
<u>vivacious</u>	Attractively lively and animated (typically used of a woman. She was dark haired and <b>vivacious</b> .
<u>vivid</u>	Having striking color. <i>Vivid green.</i>
wonderfully	(used as an intensifier) extremely well. <b>Wonderfully</b> crafted songs.
zesty	Marked by spirited enjoyment.
