cheerful	Noticeably happy and optimistic. <i>The room was painted in cheerful colours.</i>

cheery	Happy and optimistic. <i>A cheery hello.</i>
<u>effervescent</u>	(of a liquid) giving off bubbles. <i>His fertile effervescent mind.</i>
elated	Exultantly proud and joyful; in high spirits. <i>Dozens of elated fans welcomed the champions home.</i>
enthusiastic	Having or showing intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval. <i>Was enthusiastic about taking ballet lessons.</i>
<u>euphoric</u>	Exaggerated feeling of well-being or elation. <i>A euphoric sense of freedom.</i>
exhilarated	Very happy, animated, or elated. <i>The sun and the wind on his back made him feel exhilarated happy to be alive.</i>
exuberant	Produced or growing in extreme abundance. <i>A noisy bunch of exuberant youngsters.</i>
high-spirited	Joyously unrestrained.
in high spirits	Currently fashionable.
irrepressible	Impossible to repress or control. <i>An irrepressible rogue.</i>
jaunty	Having or expressing a lively, cheerful, and self-confident manner. <i>A jaunty red hat.</i>
<u>joyful</u>	Feeling, expressing, or causing great pleasure and happiness. <i>A joyful heart.</i>
jubilant	Feeling or expressing great happiness and triumph. <i>A large number of jubilant fans ran on to the pitch.</i>
light-hearted	Carefree and happy and lighthearted.
<u>merry</u>	(of an occasion or season) characterized by festivity and enjoyment. <i>He wished me a merry Christmas.</i>
<u>sparkling</u>	Shining brightly with flashes of light. <i>Sparkling water.</i>
<u>sunny</u>	(of a place) receiving much sunlight. <i>A sunny day.</i>
<u>vivacious</u>	Vigorous and animated. <i>A vivacious folk dance.</i>

gutsy	Greedy. <i>The gutsy intensity of her musical involvement.</i>
live	Continue to live through hardship or adversity. <i>Got a shock from a live wire.</i>
lively	Elastic; rebounds readily. <i>A lively period in history.</i>
luxuriant	Marked by complexity and richness of detail. <i>Forests of dark luxuriant foliage.</i>

overweening	Presumptuously arrogant- S.V.Benet- NY Times. <i>Had a witty but overweening manner.</i>
pert	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>She had a pert nose and deep blue eyes.</i>
plucky	Having or showing determined courage in the face of difficulties. <i>The plucky youngster has astounded medical staff.</i>
praise	Express approval of. <i>We praise God for past blessings.</i>
saucy	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>Saucy postcards.</i>
spirited	Made lively or spirited. <i>A spirited dance.</i>
sprightly	Full of spirit and vitality. <i>She was quite sprightly for her age.</i>
superbly	In an impressively splendid manner. <i>The team played superbly.</i>
vibrant	Vigorous and animated. <i>A vibrant cosmopolitan city.</i>
vital	Full of spirit. <i>Secrecy is of vital importance.</i>
vivacious	Attractively lively and animated (typically used of a woman). <i>She was dark haired and vivacious.</i>
vivid	Having striking color. <i>Vivid green.</i>
wonderfully	(used as an intensifier) extremely well. <i>Wonderfully crafted songs.</i>
zesty	Marked by spirited enjoyment.
