Associations of "Echoes" (30 Words)

audible	Able to be heard. <i>He saw two safeties sneaking up and called an audible.</i>
auditory	Relating to the sense of hearing. <i>Teaching methods use both visual and auditory stimulation.</i>
deaf	Make or render deaf. <i>Many of the deaf use sign language.</i>
ditto	The same thing again used in lists and accounts and often indicated by a ditto mark under the word or figure to be repeated. <i>The next speaker dittoed her argument.</i>
earshot	The range within which a voice can be heard. <i>The children were told to stay within earshot.</i>
hearing	The act of hearing attentively. <i>People who have very acute hearing.</i>
iterate	Make repeated use of a mathematical or computational procedure, applying it each time to the result of the previous application; perform iteration. <i>The bird s call is a monotonously iterated single note.</i>
listening	The act of hearing attentively. <i>You can learn a lot by just listening.</i>
mimic	An animal or plant that mimics another. <i>They were waging mimic war.</i>
noise	Emit a noise. <i>Modern music is just noise to me.</i>
pummel	Strike, usually with the fist. <i>He has been pummelled by the reviewers.</i>
recapitulate	Repeat an earlier theme of a composition. <i>Let s recapitulate the main ideas.</i>

reflect	Be bright by reflecting or casting light. <i>Her sunglasses reflected his image.</i>
reiterate	To say, state, or perform again. <i>He reiterated the points made in his earlier speech.</i>
repeat	Repeat an earlier theme of a composition. <i>The first team in nineteen years to repeat as NBA champions.</i>
repeatedly	Over and over again; constantly. <i>They have been warned repeatedly with no effect.</i>
replicate	Make an exact copy of; reproduce. <i>The variation of replicate measurements.</i>
reprise	Repeat (a piece of music or a performance). <i>He reprises his role as the vigilante architect.</i>
resonance	An excited state of a stable particle causing a sharp maximum in the probability of absorption of electromagnetic radiation. <i>The concepts lose their emotional resonance.</i>
resonate	Be received or understood. <i>The words resonate with so many different meanings.</i>
resound	(of fame, an achievement, etc.) be much talked of. <i>Horace resounds the praises of Italy.</i>
restate	State (something) again or differently, especially more clearly or convincingly. <i>He restated his opposition to abortion.</i>
reverberate	Have a long or continuing effect. <i>The discussions with my teacher reverberated throughout my adult life.</i>
reverberation	Prolongation of a sound; resonance. <i>Reverberations of the market crash were felt years later.</i>
ring	Attach a ring to the foot of in order to identify. <i>The courthouse was ringed with police.</i>
sonar	An apparatus used in sonar. <i>Sonar is an acronym for sound navigation ranging.</i>
sonic	Relating to audible sound. <i>The whales emit sonic pulse systems.</i>
speaking	Capable of or involving speech or speaking. <i>A speaking part in the play.</i>
squeaking	Having or making a high-pitched sound such as that made by a mouse or a rusty hinge.
