## Associations of "Echoes" (30 Words)

<b><a href="#">audible</a></b>	Able to be heard. <i>He saw two safeties sneaking up and called an <b>audible</b>.</i>
<b>auditory</b>	Relating to the sense of hearing. <i>Teaching methods use both visual and <b>auditory</b> stimulation.</i>
<b>deaf</b>	Make or render deaf. <i>Many of the <b>deaf</b> use sign language.</i>
<b><a href="#">ditto</a></b>	The same thing again used in lists and accounts and often indicated by a ditto mark under the word or figure to be repeated. <i>The next speaker <b>dittoed</b> her argument.</i>
<b>earshot</b>	The range within which a voice can be heard. <i>The children were told to stay within <b>earshot</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">hearing</a></b>	The act of hearing attentively. <i>People who have very acute <b>hearing</b>.</i>
<b>iterate</b>	Make repeated use of a mathematical or computational procedure, applying it each time to the result of the previous application; perform iteration. <i>The bird s call is a monotonously <b>iterated</b> single note.</i>
<b>listening</b>	The act of hearing attentively. <i>You can learn a lot by just <b>listening</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">mimic</a></b>	An animal or plant that mimics another. <i>They were waging <b>mimic</b> war.</i>
<b>noise</b>	Emit a noise. <i>Modern music is just <b>noise</b> to me.</i>
<b>pummel</b>	Strike, usually with the fist. <i>He has been <b>pummelled</b> by the reviewers.</i>
<b>recapitulate</b>	Repeat an earlier theme of a composition. <i>Let s <b>recapitulate</b> the main ideas.</i>

<b>reflect</b>	Be bright by reflecting or casting light. <i>Her sunglasses <b>reflected</b> his image.</i>
<b>reiterate</b>	To say, state, or perform again. <i>He <b>reiterated</b> the points made in his earlier speech.</i>
<b>repeat</b>	Repeat an earlier theme of a composition. <i>The first team in nineteen years to <b>repeat</b> as NBA champions.</i>
<b>repeatedly</b>	Over and over again; constantly. <i>They have been warned <b>repeatedly</b> with no effect.</i>
<b>replicate</b>	Make an exact copy of; reproduce. <i>The variation of <b>replicate</b> measurements.</i>
<b>reprise</b>	Repeat (a piece of music or a performance). <i>He <b>reprises</b> his role as the vigilante architect.</i>
<b>resonance</b>	An excited state of a stable particle causing a sharp maximum in the probability of absorption of electromagnetic radiation. <i>The concepts lose their emotional <b>resonance</b>.</i>
<b>resonate</b>	Be received or understood. <i>The words <b>resonate</b> with so many different meanings.</i>
<b>resound</b>	(of fame, an achievement, etc.) be much talked of. <i>Horace <b>resounds</b> the praises of Italy.</i>
<b>restate</b>	State (something) again or differently, especially more clearly or convincingly. <i>He <b>restated</b> his opposition to abortion.</i>
<b>reverberate</b>	Have a long or continuing effect. <i>The discussions with my teacher <b>reverberated</b> throughout my adult life.</i>
<b>reverberation</b>	Prolongation of a sound; resonance. <i><b>Reverberations</b> of the market crash were felt years later.</i>
<b>ring</b>	Attach a ring to the foot of in order to identify. <i>The courthouse was <b>ringed</b> with police.</i>
<b>sonar</b>	An apparatus used in sonar. <i><b>Sonar</b> is an acronym for sound navigation ranging.</i>
<b>sonic</b>	Relating to audible sound. <i>The whales emit <b>sonic</b> pulse systems.</i>
<b>speaking</b>	Capable of or involving speech or speaking. <i>A <b>speaking</b> part in the play.</i>
<b>squeaking</b>	Having or making a high-pitched sound such as that made by a mouse or a rusty hinge.
