- *Involving an experience of mystic self-transcendence.*

<b>elated</b>	Exultantly proud and joyful; in high spirits. <i>Dozens of <b>elated</b> fans welcomed the champions home.</i>
<b>enraptured</b>	Feeling great rapture or delight.
<b>euphoric</b>	Characterized by or feeling intense excitement and happiness. <i>A <b>euphoric</b> sense of freedom.</i>
<b>in raptures</b>	Directed or bound inward.
<b>in transports</b>	Directed or bound inward.
<b>rapt</b>	Filled with an intense and pleasurable emotion enraptured. <i>A <b>rapt</b> teenage audience.</i>
<b>rapturous</b>	Characterized by, feeling, or expressing great pleasure or enthusiasm. <i>He was greeted with <b>rapturous</b> applause.</i>
<b>rhapsodic</b>	Feeling great rapture or delight.

- *Ecstatic fans filled the stadium.*
- *An ecstatic vision of God.*

## Associations of "Ecstatic" (30 Words)

<b>apotheosis</b>	The elevation of a person (as to the status of a god). <i>His appearance as Hamlet was the <b>apotheosis</b> of his career.</i>
<b>beatitude</b>	The blessings listed by Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 5:3-11). <i>The expression of <b>beatitude</b> the religious sometimes adopt.</i>
<b>blessedness</b>	The state of being blessed with divine favour.
<b>blissful</b>	Completely happy and contented. <i><b>Blissful</b> young lovers.</i>
<b>cheering</b>	Providing freedom from worry. <i><b>Cheering</b> news.</i>
<b>delight</b>	Take delight in. <i>An experience guaranteed to <b>delight</b> both young and old.</i>
<b>delighted</b>	Filled with wonder and delight. <i>A <b>delighted</b> smile.</i>
<b>ecstasy</b>	A state of being carried away by overwhelming emotion. <i>There was a look of <b>ecstasy</b> on his face.</i>
<b>elated</b>	Full of high-spirited delight. <i>The <b>elated</b> winner.</i>
<b>engrossed</b>	Written formally in a large clear script, as a deed or other legal document. <i>That <b>engrossed</b> look or rapt delight.</i>
<b>enjoyable</b>	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>The company was <b>enjoyable</b>.</i>
<b>enraptured</b>	Feeling great rapture or delight.
<b>euphoria</b>	A feeling of great (usually exaggerated) elation. <i>In his <b>euphoria</b> he had become convinced he could defeat them.</i>
<b>euphoric</b>	Characterized by or feeling intense excitement and happiness. <i>A <b>euphoric</b> sense of freedom.</i>
<b>exaltation</b>	A state of being carried away by overwhelming emotion. <i>She was in a frenzy of <b>exaltation</b> and terror.</i>
<b>exciting</b>	Causing great enthusiasm and eagerness. <i>One of the most <b>exciting</b> matches I ve ever seen.</i>
<b>exultant</b>	Triumphantly happy. <i>He waved to the <b>exultant</b> crowds.</i>
<b>exultation</b>	A feeling of extreme joy. <i>She laughs in <b>exultation</b>.</i>

<b>glad</b>	Any of numerous plants of the genus <i>Gladiolus</i> native chiefly to tropical and South Africa having sword-shaped leaves and one-sided spikes of brightly colored funnel-shaped flowers; widely cultivated. <b>Glad</b> that they succeeded.
<b>happy</b>	Marked by good fortune. He was not <b>happy</b> about the proposals.
<b>joy</b>	Feel happiness or joy. The <b>joy</b> of being alive.
<b>joyful</b>	Feeling, expressing, or causing great pleasure and happiness. A <b>joyful</b> occasion.
<b>joyous</b>	Full of or characterized by joy. <b>Joyous</b> laughter.
<b>jubilant</b>	Feeling or expressing great happiness and triumph. A large number of <b>jubilant</b> fans ran on to the pitch.
<b>merry</b>	Quick and energetic. The streets were dense with <b>merry</b> throngs of students.
<b>pleased</b>	Feeling pleasurable satisfaction over something by which you measures your self-worth. As he led the way he looked very <b>pleased</b> with himself.
<b>rapt</b>	Filled with an intense and pleasurable emotion enraptured. He was <b>rapt</b> on high.
<b>rapture</b>	A state of being carried away by overwhelming emotion- Charles Dickens. Listening to sweet music in a perfect <b>rapture</b> .
<b>rapturous</b>	Characterized by, feeling, or expressing great pleasure or enthusiasm. He was greeted with <b>rapturous</b> applause.
