### Definitions of "Edited" as an adjective

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "edited" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- (of material for a film or radio or television programme) chosen and arranged to form a coherent whole.
- (of written material) corrected, condensed, or otherwise modified in preparation for publication.
- Improved or corrected by critical editing.
