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| <u>academy</u> | A society or institution of distinguished scholars and artists or scientists that aims to promote and maintain standards in its particular field. <i>A police academy.</i> |
| <u>campus</u> | The grounds and buildings of a university or college. <i>For the first year I had a room on campus.</i> |
| civilize | Raise from a barbaric to a civilized state. <i>The wild child found wandering in the forest was gradually civilized.</i> |
| college | The body of faculty and students of a college. <i>I m at college studying graphic design.</i> |
| diploma | An official document or charter. |
| <u>discipline</u> | A system of rules of conduct or method of practice. <i>Every month discipline yourself to go through the file.</i> |
| education | The United States federal department that administers all federal programs dealing with education including federal aid to educational institutions and students created 1979. <i>It was clear that he had a very broad education.</i> |
| <u>educator</u> | Someone who educates young people. <i>The perspective of a professional educator.</i> |
| homeroom | A classroom in which a group of students assembles daily with the same teacher before dispersing to other classes. |
| <u>instruct</u> | Give instructions or directions for some task. <i>The bank was instructed that the money from the deposit account was now held by the company.</i> |
| instruction | The profession of a teacher. <i>He was acting on my instructions.</i> |
| instructor | A university teacher ranking below assistant professor. <i>A driving instructor.</i> |

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| lecture | Give a lecture to a class or other audience. <i>A lecture hall.</i> |
| lesson | Instruct or teach (someone). <i>A driving lesson.</i> |
| matriculate | A person who has matriculated. <i>He was matriculated at Balliol College Oxford.</i> |
| pedagogics | The principles and methods of instruction. |
| pedagogy | The profession of a teacher. <i>Pedagogy is recognized as an important profession.</i> |
| polytechnic | An institution of higher education offering courses at degree level or below, especially in vocational subjects. |
| precept | A rate or tax set by a precept. <i>He believed all the Christian precepts.</i> |
| pupil | A young person attending school (up through senior high school). <i>They are former pupils of the school.</i> |
| reading | The action or skill of reading. <i>Suggestions for further reading.</i> |
| <u>schooling</u> | The training of an animal (especially the training of a horse for dressage). <i>His parents paid for his schooling.</i> |
| schoolmaster | Presiding officer of a school. |
| studying | Reading carefully with intent to remember. |
| teach | Work as a teacher. <i>She teaches me French.</i> |
| teaching | The activities of educating or instructing; activities that impart knowledge or skill. <i>I went into teaching because I like working with children.</i> |
| <u>trainee</u> | Someone who is being trained. <i>Trainee solicitors.</i> |
| <u>tuition</u> | A sum of money charged for teaching by a college or university. <i>Tuition fees.</i> |
| undergraduate | Denoting or relating to an undergraduate. <i>Undergraduate students.</i> |
| <u>university</u> | The body of faculty and students at a university. <i>His daughter is at university.</i> |
