<u>cheerful</u>	Causing happiness by its nature or appearance. <i>A cheerful greeting.</i>
cheery	Happy and optimistic. <i>A cheery smile.</i>
dynamic	Of or relating to dynamics. <i>A dynamic economy.</i>
<u>ebullient</u>	(of liquid or matter) boiling or agitated as if boiling. <i>Misted and ebullient seas.</i>
<u>energetic</u>	Working hard to promote an enterprise. <i>Moderately energetic exercise.</i>
enthusiastic	Having or showing great excitement and interest. <i>An enthusiastic response.</i>

foaming	Producing or covered with lathery sweat or saliva from exhaustion or disease. <i>Pints of foaming bitter.</i>
frothy	Full of or covered with a mass of small bubbles. <i>Foamy or frothy beer.</i>
full of fun	Having the normally expected amount.
full of life	Filled to satisfaction with food or drink.
full of the joys of spring	Filled to satisfaction with food or drink.
full of vim and vigour	Complete in extent or degree and in every particular.
gassy	Resembling gas. <i>A long and gassy book.</i>
happy	Satisfied with the quality or standard of. <i>Melissa came in looking happy and excited.</i>
happy-go-lucky	Having or bringing good fortune.
high-spirited	Joyously unrestrained.
irrepressible	Impossible to repress or control. <i>An irrepressible rogue.</i>
jaunty	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>Walked with a jaunty step.</i>
jolly	Lively and entertaining. <i>Jolly old Saint Nick.</i>
joyful	Full of high-spirited delight. <i>A joyful heart.</i>
light-hearted	Carefree and happy and lighthearted.
lively	(of a boat) rising lightly to the waves. <i>Lively and attractive parents.</i>
merry	Offering fun and gaiety. <i>Peals of merry laughter.</i>
perky	Characterized by liveliness and lightheartedness. <i>She certainly looked less than her usual perky self.</i>
scintillating	Marked by high spirits or excitement. <i>A play full of scintillating dialogue.</i>
sparkling	Used of wines and waters; charged naturally or artificially with carbon dioxide. <i>Sparkling dialogue.</i>

sparkly

Marked by high spirits or excitement.
*A row of **sparkly** cheerleaders.*

spirited

Made lively or spirited.
*A **spirited** debate.*

sunny

(of a place) receiving much sunlight.
*A **sunny** smile.*

vibrant

(of sound) strong or resonating.
*His **vibrant** voice.*

vigorous

Characterized by forceful and energetic action or activity.
*A **vigorous** denial.*

vital

Full of energy; lively.
***Vital** signs.*

vivacious

Attractively lively and animated (typically used of a woman).
*A charming and **vivacious** hostess.*

vivid

(of color) having the highest saturation.
***Vivid** green.*

zestful

Characterized by great enthusiasm and energy.
*A **zestful** and exuberant player.*

<u>industrious</u>	Working hard to promote an enterprise. <i>An industrious people striving to make their country prosperous.</i>
lively	Quick and energetic. <i>A lively tennis ball.</i>
nimble	Moving quickly and lightly. <i>Nimble fingers.</i>
pep	Make someone or something more lively or interesting. <i>This tonic is guaranteed to give you more pep.</i>
propulsive	Having the power to propel. <i>A strong blast of air gave the vehicle its propulsive force.</i>
<u>provocative</u>	Serving or tending to provoke, excite, or stimulate; stimulating discussion or exciting controversy- Anthony Trollope. <i>Her gestures and postures became more wanton and provocative.</i>
rousing	Rousing to activity or heightened action as by spurring or goading. <i>Tossed a rousing political comment into the conversation.</i>
scintillating	Sparkling or shining brightly. <i>A play full of scintillating dialogue.</i>
seditionous	In opposition to a civil authority or government. <i>The letter was declared seditionous.</i>

sprightly	(especially of an old person) lively; full of energy. <i>A sprightly dance.</i>
stimulate	Stir the feelings, emotions, or peace of. <i>This play stimulates.</i>
stirring	Exciting strong but not unpleasant emotions. <i>Constant stirring prevents it from burning on the bottom of the pan.</i>
strenuous	Taxing to the utmost; testing powers of endurance- F.D.Roosevelt. <i>Strenuous exercise.</i>
tireless	Characterized by hard work and perseverance. <i>A tireless campaigner.</i>
unflagging	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. <i>Unflagging pursuit of excellence.</i>
vigorous	Characterized by forceful and energetic action or activity. <i>A vigorous old man who spent half of his day on horseback.</i>
