<a href="#"><u>ebullient</u></a>	(of liquid or matter) boiling or agitated as if boiling. <i>Misted and <b>ebullient</b> seas.</i>

<b>enthusiastic</b>	Having or showing great excitement and interest. <i>An <b>enthusiastic</b> response.</i>

<b>foaming</b>	Producing or covered with lathery sweat or saliva from exhaustion or disease. <i>Pints of <b>foaming</b> bitter.</i>
<b>frothy</b>	Full of or covered with a mass of small bubbles. <i>Foamy or <b>frothy</b> beer.</i>
<b>full of fun</b>	Having the normally expected amount.
<b>full of life</b>	Filled to satisfaction with food or drink.
<b>full of the joys of spring</b>	Filled to satisfaction with food or drink.
<b>full of vim and vigour</b>	Complete in extent or degree and in every particular.
<b>gassy</b>	Resembling gas. <i>A long and <b>gassy</b> book.</i>
<b>happy</b>	Satisfied with the quality or standard of. <i>Melissa came in looking <b>happy</b> and excited.</i>
<b>happy-go-lucky</b>	Having or bringing good fortune.
<b>high-spirited</b>	Joyously unrestrained.
<b>irrepressible</b>	Impossible to repress or control. <i>An <b>irrepressible</b> rogue.</i>
<b>jaunty</b>	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>Walked with a <b>jaunty</b> step.</i>
<b>jolly</b>	Lively and entertaining. <i><b>Jolly</b> old Saint Nick.</i>
<b>joyful</b>	Full of high-spirited delight. <i>A <b>joyful</b> heart.</i>
<b>light-hearted</b>	Carefree and happy and lighthearted.
<b>lively</b>	(of a boat) rising lightly to the waves. <i><b>Lively</b> and attractive parents.</i>

<b>lively</b>	Quick and energetic. <i>A <b>lively</b> tennis ball.</i>
<b>nimble</b>	Moving quickly and lightly. <i><b>Nimble</b> fingers.</i>
<b>pep</b>	Make someone or something more lively or interesting. <i>This tonic is guaranteed to give you more <b>pep</b>.</i>
<b>propulsive</b>	Having the power to propel. <i>A strong blast of air gave the vehicle its <b>propulsive</b> force.</i>

<b>sedition</b>	In opposition to a civil authority or government. <i>The letter was declared <b>sedition</b>.</i>
