fair	Complete; utter. The fairest of her daughters.
<u>just</u>	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. These simplistic approaches have been the subject of just criticism.

bioethics	The ethics of medical and biological research.
<u>candidacy</u>	The campaign of a candidate to be elected. <i>He s going to announce his candidacy for the US Senate.</i>
caucus	Hold or form a legislative caucus. <i>She is renowned for her ability to unite her caucus.</i>
<u>communism</u>	A form of socialism that abolishes private ownership.
confucian	Relating to or characteristic of Confucianism.
<u>conservative</u>	Relating to the Conservative Party in the UK or a similar party elsewhere. <i>The Massachusetts liberal who conservatives love to hate.</i>
democracy	A state governed under a system of democracy. <i>The intended extension of industrial democracy.</i>
democrat	An advocate of democratic principles. <i>As a democrat I accepted the outcome of the referendum.</i>
democratic	Belong to or relating to the Democratic Party. <i>Cycling is a very democratic activity which can be enjoyed by anyone.</i>
democratize	Introduce a democratic system or democratic principles to. <i>Public institutions need to be democratized.</i>
<u>elective</u>	(of a person or office) appointed or filled by election. <i>The National Assembly with 125 elective members.</i>

emulation	Technique of one machine obtaining the same results as another. <i>An additional server is accessed via emulation software.</i>
fascism	A political theory advocating an authoritarian hierarchical government (as opposed to democracy or liberalism). <i>This is yet another example of health fascism in action.</i>
feudalistic	Of or relating to or characteristic of feudalism.
heterodox	Characterized by departure from accepted beliefs or standards. Heterodox views.
legislator	Someone who makes or enacts laws. <i>Statutes went unread by the legislators who passed them.</i>
<u>liberal</u>	(especially of an interpretation of a law) broadly construed or understood; not strictly literal or exact. <i>The strategy was to portray the press as members of a liberal elite.</i>
liberalist	A person who favors a political philosophy of progress and reform and the protection of civil liberties.
<u>mainstream</u>	Belonging to or characteristic of the mainstream. <i>Vegetarianism has been mainstreamed.</i>
nomination	An address (usually at a political convention) proposing the name of a candidate to run for election. <i>Send your nominations in by 30th November.</i>
political	Done or acting in the interests of status or power within an organization rather than as a matter of principle. <i>Calling a meeting is a political act in itself.</i>
<u>president</u>	An executive officer of a firm or corporation. <i>The president of the European Union.</i>
presidential	Relating to a president or presidency. <i>The presidential palace.</i>
<u>republic</u>	A group with a certain equality between its members. <i>The head of state in a republic is usually a president.</i>
social	An informal social gathering especially one organized by the members of a particular club or group. <i>Alcoholism is recognized as a major social problem.</i>
socialism	Policy or practice based on the political and economic theory of socialism.
society	A specified section of society. <i>A society wedding.</i>
totalitarianism	The principle of complete and unrestricted power in government. <i>Democratic countries were fighting against totalitarianism.</i>

values	Beliefs of a person or social group in which they have an emotional investment (either for or against something). <i>He has very conservatives values.</i>
voter	A citizen who has a legal right to vote.
