A political theory advocating an authoritarian hierarchical government (as

fascism opposed to democracy or liberalism.

This is yet another example of health **fascism** in action.

feudalistic Of or relating to or characteristic of feudalism.

heterodox Characterized by departure from accepted beliefs or standards.

Heterodox views.

legislator Someone who makes or enacts laws.

Statutes went unread by the **legislator**s who passed them.

(especially of an interpretation of a law) broadly construed or understood;

<u>liberal</u> not strictly literal or exact.

The strategy was to portray the press as members of a **liberal** elite.

mainstream Belonging to or characteristic of the mainstream.
