Definitions of "Egocentric" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "egocentric" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Centred in or arising from a person's own individual existence or perspective.*
- *Thinking only of oneself, without regard for the feelings or desires of others; self-centred.*
- *Limited to or caring only about yourself and your own needs.*

conceited	Excessively proud of oneself; vain. <i>Fred s so conceited he d never believe anyone would refuse him.</i>
egoistic	Limited to or caring only about yourself and your own needs.
egoistical	Limited to or caring only about yourself and your own needs.
narcissistic	Having or showing an excessive interest in or admiration of oneself and one's physical appearance. <i>Narcissistic personality disorder.</i>
proud	Of an event achievement etc causing someone to feel proud. <i>I was too proud to go home.</i>
self-absorbed	Absorbed in your own interests or thoughts etc.
self-centered	Limited to or caring only about yourself and your own needs.
self-centred	Limited to or caring only about yourself and your own needs.
self-important	Having or showing feelings of unwarranted importance out of overbearing pride.
self-loving	Characteristic of those having an inflated idea of their own importance.
self-seeking	Interested only in yourself.
selfish	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others. <i>I joined them for selfish reasons.</i>
vain	Having no likelihood of fulfilment; empty. <i>Their flattery made him vain.</i>

Associations of "Egocentric" (30 Words)

<u>acquisitive</u>	Eager to acquire and possess things especially material possessions or ideas. <i>We live in a competitive and acquisitive society.</i>
arty	Making a strong, affected, or pretentious display of being artistic or interested in the arts. <i>A very arty film.</i>

clannish	Befitting or characteristic of those who incline to social exclusiveness and who rebuff the advances of people considered inferior. <i>Clannish loyalty.</i>
conceit	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>He was puffed up with conceit.</i>
conceited	Excessively proud of oneself; vain. <i>Fred s so conceited he d never believe anyone would refuse him.</i>
covetousness	An envious eagerness to possess something.
<u>ego</u>	(psychoanalysis) the conscious mind. <i>He needed a boost to his ego.</i>
egocentrism	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
egoism	An ethical theory that treats self-interest as the foundation of morality.
egoist	A conceited and self-centered person.
egotism	The fact of being excessively conceited or absorbed in oneself. <i>In his arrogance and egotism he underestimated Gill.</i>
egotist	A conceited and self-centered person. <i>He is a self absorbed egotist.</i>
grandiose	Affectedly genteel. <i>The court s grandiose facade.</i>
grasping	Understanding with difficulty. <i>The lecture was beyond his most strenuous graspings.</i>
greed	Excessive desire to acquire or possess more (especially more material wealth) than one needs or deserves. <i>The colonists greed for African land.</i>
greedy	Wanting to eat or drink more than one can reasonably consume. <i>Don t be greedy with the cookies.</i>
haughtiness	Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors. <i>Her air of haughtiness.</i>
<u>hubris</u>	Excessive pride or self-confidence. <i>The self assured hubris among economists was shaken in the late 1980s.</i>
individualist	A person who is independent and self-reliant. <i>Individualist attitudes.</i>
<u>individualistic</u>	Marked by or expressing individuality. <i>An individualistic way of dressing.</i>
interest	The selfish pursuit of one s own welfare self interest. <i>In the interest of safety.</i>

narcissism	Self-centredness arising from failure to distinguish the self from external objects, either in very young babies or as a feature of mental disorder.
prehensile	Having a keen intellect- A.T.Quiller-Couch. <i>Poets those gifted strangely prehensile men.</i>
pretentious	Attempting to impress by affecting greater importance or merit than is actually possessed. <i>A pretentious country house.</i>
<u>pride</u>	The best state of something; the prime. <i>The underlying theme of the song is black pride.</i>
proud	Of an event achievement etc causing someone to feel proud. <i>He was a proud arrogant man.</i>
selfish	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others. <i>I joined them for selfish reasons.</i>
selfishness	The quality or state of being selfish; lack of consideration for other people. <i>An act of pure selfishness.</i>
<u>snobbish</u>	Relating to, characteristic of, or like a snob. <i>The writer takes a rather snobbish tone.</i>
<u>vanity</u>	Low table with mirror or mirrors where one sits while dressing or applying makeup. <i>A vanity press.</i>
