### Definitions of "Egocentric" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "egocentric" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Centred in or arising from a person's own individual existence or perspective.*
- *Thinking only of oneself, without regard for the feelings or desires of others; self-centred.*
- *Limited to or caring only about yourself and your own needs.*

<b>narcissistic</b>	Having or showing an excessive interest in or admiration of oneself and one's physical appearance. <i><b>Narcissistic</b> personality disorder.</i>
<b>proud</b>	Of an event achievement etc causing someone to feel proud. <i>I was too <b>proud</b> to go home.</i>
<b>self-absorbed</b>	Absorbed in your own interests or thoughts etc.
<b>self-centered</b>	Limited to or caring only about yourself and your own needs.
<b>self-centred</b>	Limited to or caring only about yourself and your own needs.
<b>self-important</b>	Having or showing feelings of unwarranted importance out of overbearing pride.
<b>self-loving</b>	Characteristic of those having an inflated idea of their own importance.
<b>self-seeking</b>	Interested only in yourself.
<b>selfish</b>	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others. <i>I joined them for <b>selfish</b> reasons.</i>
<b>vain</b>	Having no likelihood of fulfilment; empty. <i>Their flattery made him <b>vain</b>.</i>

## Associations of "Egocentric" (30 Words)

<b>acquisitive</b>	Eager to acquire and possess things especially material possessions or ideas. <i>We live in a competitive and <b>acquisitive</b> society.</i>
<b>arty</b>	Making a strong, affected, or pretentious display of being artistic or interested in the arts. <i>A very <b>arty</b> film.</i>

<b>clannish</b>	Befitting or characteristic of those who incline to social exclusiveness and who rebuff the advances of people considered inferior. <i><b>Clannish</b> loyalty.</i>
<b>conceit</b>	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>He was puffed up with <b>conceit</b>.</i>
<b>conceited</b>	Excessively proud of oneself; vain. <i>Fred s so <b>conceited</b> he d never believe anyone would refuse him.</i>
<b>covetousness</b>	An envious eagerness to possess something.
<b>ego</b>	(psychoanalysis) the conscious mind. <i>He needed a boost to his <b>ego</b>.</i>
<b>egocentrism</b>	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
<b>egoism</b>	An ethical theory that treats self-interest as the foundation of morality.
<b>egoist</b>	A conceited and self-centered person.
<b>egotism</b>	The fact of being excessively conceited or absorbed in oneself. <i>In his arrogance and <b>egotism</b> he underestimated Gill.</i>
<b>egotist</b>	A conceited and self-centered person. <i>He is a self absorbed <b>egotist</b>.</i>
<b>grandiose</b>	Affectedly genteel. <i>The court s <b>grandiose</b> facade.</i>
<b>grasping</b>	Understanding with difficulty. <i>The lecture was beyond his most strenuous <b>graspings</b>.</i>
<b>greed</b>	Excessive desire to acquire or possess more (especially more material wealth) than one needs or deserves. <i>The colonists <b>greed</b> for African land.</i>
<b>greedy</b>	Wanting to eat or drink more than one can reasonably consume. <i>Don t be <b>greedy</b> with the cookies.</i>
<b>haughtiness</b>	Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors. <i>Her air of <b>haughtiness</b>.</i>
<b>hubris</b>	Excessive pride or self-confidence. <i>The self assured <b>hubris</b> among economists was shaken in the late 1980s.</i>
<b>individualist</b>	A person who is independent and self-reliant. <i><b>Individualist</b> attitudes.</i>
<b>individualistic</b>	Marked by or expressing individuality. <i>An <b>individualistic</b> way of dressing.</i>
<b>interest</b>	The selfish pursuit of one s own welfare self interest. <i>In the <b>interest</b> of safety.</i>

<b>narcissism</b>	Self-centredness arising from failure to distinguish the self from external objects, either in very young babies or as a feature of mental disorder.
<b>prehensile</b>	Having a keen intellect- A.T.Quiller-Couch. <i>Poets those gifted strangely <b>prehensile</b> men.</i>
<b>pretentious</b>	Attempting to impress by affecting greater importance or merit than is actually possessed. <i>A <b>pretentious</b> country house.</i>
<b>pride</b>	The best state of something; the prime. <i>The underlying theme of the song is black <b>pride</b>.</i>
<b>proud</b>	Of an event achievement etc causing someone to feel proud. <i>He was a <b>proud</b> arrogant man.</i>
<b>selfish</b>	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others. <i>I joined them for <b>selfish</b> reasons.</i>
<b>selfishness</b>	The quality or state of being selfish; lack of consideration for other people. <i>An act of pure <b>selfishness</b>.</i>
<b>snobbish</b>	Relating to, characteristic of, or like a snob. <i>The writer takes a rather <b>snobbish</b> tone.</i>
<b>vanity</b>	Low table with mirror or mirrors where one sits while dressing or applying makeup. <i>A <b>vanity</b> press.</i>
