antarctic	At or near the south pole.
anyhow	In any way whatsoever. <i>I think they re asleep anyhow they re quiet.</i>
approach	A close approximation. <i>Winter is approaching.</i>
boreal	Relating to or denoting the second climatic stage of the postglacial period in northern Europe between the Preboreal and Atlantic stages about 9 000 to 7 500 years ago marked by a warm dry climate. <i>Northern boreal forest.</i>
derogatory	Showing a critical or disrespectful attitude. <i>Derogatory comments.</i>
direction	Something that provides direction or advice as to a decision or course of action. <i>Preston gave him directions to a restaurant not far from the studio.</i>
disparaging	Expressing the opinion that something is of little worth; derogatory. <i>Disparaging remarks about the new house.</i>
eastern	Of or characteristic of eastern regions of the United States. <i>Eastern cities.</i>
europe	The 2nd smallest continent (actually a vast peninsula of Eurasia); the British use `Europe' to refer to all of the continent except the British Isles.
flank	A cut of meat from the flank of an animal. <i>A thick flank of beef.</i>
guidance	Something that provides direction or advice as to a decision or course of action. <i>A laser guidance system.</i>
inimitable	Defying imitation; matchless. <i>They took the charts by storm with their inimitable style.</i>

irrespective	Not taking (something) into account; regardless of. <i>Child benefit is paid irrespective of income levels.</i>
north	In a northern direction. <i>The town is twenty five miles north of Newport.</i>
northern	Situated in or coming from regions of the north. <i>The northern hemisphere.</i>
occident	The countries of (originally) Europe and (now including) North America and South America.
occidental	A native or inhabitant of the West. <i>Modern occidental society.</i>
orientation	The relative position or direction of something. <i>Many judges give instructions to assist jury orientation.</i>
oriented	Adjusted or located in relation to surroundings or circumstances; sometimes used in combination. <i>Helping freshmen become oriented to college life.</i>
<u>pejorative</u>	Expressing contempt or disapproval. <i>Permissiveness is used almost universally as a pejorative term.</i>
<u>province</u>	The whole of a country outside the capital, especially when regarded as lacking in sophistication or culture. <i>It was his province to take care of himself.</i>
south	The direction corresponding to the southward cardinal compass point. <i>We moved south.</i>
southbound	Travelling or leading towards the south. <i>A southbound train.</i>
southeast	Situated in or oriented toward the southeast. <i>Southeasterly breezes.</i>
southern	Situated in or coming from regions of the south. <i>A southern exposure.</i>
southward	Toward the south. <i>Cool air from the ocean to the southward.</i>
southwest	The southwestern region of the United States generally including New Mexico Arizona Texas Nevada California and sometimes Utah and Colorado. <i>The winds are southwesterly.</i>
unidirectional	Moving or operating in a single direction. <i>A unidirectional approach to a problem.</i>

west	Of or denoting the western part of a specified area city or country or its inhabitants. <i>The west coast.</i>
western	A sandwich made from a western omelet. <i>The western world.</i>
