| beck | A beckoning gesture. |
| brook | Put up with something or somebody unpleasant. <i>The Lake District boasts lovely lakes and babbling brooks.</i> |
| confluence | A flowing together. <i>A major confluence of the world s financial markets.</i> |
| creek | A stream or minor tributary of a river. <i>The creek dried up every summer.</i> |
| downstream | Taking place at or relating to a stage in the process of gas or oil extraction and production after the raw material is ready for refining. <i>Many of the protein gene sequences in this study appear to end with a single T that is directly adjacent to the downstream gene.</i> |
| eel | Used in names of unrelated fishes that resemble the true eels e g electric eel moray eel. |
| estuary | The tidal mouth of a large river, where the tide meets the stream. |
| flow | Cause to flow. <i>The museum had planned carefully for the flow of visitors.</i> |
| flowing | The motion characteristic of fluids (liquids or gases). <i>A long flowing gown of lavender silk.</i> |
| fluvial | Of or relating to or happening in a river. <i>Fluvial deposits.</i> |
| ford | A shallow area in a stream that can be forded. |
| glen | A narrow valley, especially in Scotland or Ireland. |
| gully | A fielder at gully. <i>He was caught in the gully by Jones.</i> |
| inlet | An arm off of a larger body of water (often between rocky headlands). <i>An air inlet.</i> |

| lake | A pool of liquid. <i>The EU wine lake.</i> |
| lamprey | Primitive eellike freshwater or anadromous cyclostome having round sucking mouth with a rasping tongue. |
| meltwater | Water formed by the melting of snow and ice, especially from a glacier. <i>Meltwater lies in pools on the frozen ground.</i> |
| <u>river</u> | A large natural stream of water flowing in a channel to the sea a lake or another river. <i>River pollution.</i> |
| riverbank | The bank of a river. |
| rivulet | A brownish European moth with white markings, occurring in rough grassland. <i>Sweat ran in rivulets down his back.</i> |
| <u>stream</u> | The act of flowing or streaming continuous progression. <i>Her black cloak streamed behind her.</i> |
| teem | Be teeming be abuzz. <i>Every garden is teeming with wildlife.</i> |
| terrapin | A small edible turtle with lozenge-shaped markings on its shell, found in coastal marshes of the eastern US. |
| thames | The longest river in England; flows eastward through London to the North Sea. |
| tributary | Paying tribute. <i>The Illinois River a tributary of the Mississippi.</i> |
| trout | Any of various game and food fishes of cool fresh waters mostly smaller than typical salmons. |
| upstream | Situated in or towards the part of a sequence of genetic material where transcription takes place earlier than at a given point. <i>The upstream stretch of the river.</i> |
| <u>vale</u> | A long depression in the surface of the land that usually contains a river. <i>The Vale of Glamorgan.</i> |
| <u>valley</u> | An internal angle formed by the intersecting planes of a roof, or by the slope of a roof and a wall. <i>The valley floor.</i> |
| <u>waterfall</u> | A steep descent of the water of a river. <i>Each phase of a waterfall project must be complete prior to moving to the next phase.</i> |
