- A person who is older than you are.
- A leader or senior figure in a tribe or other group.
- Any of various church officers.
- A member of a senate or governing body.
- People who are older than one.
- An official in the early Christian Church, or of various Protestant Churches and sects.

senior figure	An undergraduate student during the year preceding graduation.

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "elder" as an adjective can have the following definitions:


- Used to distinguish between related famous people with the same name.

<u>aged</u>

Aging as a preservative process aged is pronounced as one syllable. *Aged* rocks.



<u>aging</u>	The organic process of growing older and showing the effects of increasing age.
anachronistic	Belonging to a period other than that being portrayed. English public schools are <b>anachronistic</b> .
<u>ancestor</u>	A person, typically one more remote than a grandparent, from whom one is descended. <i>He could trace his ancestor</i> s back to James the First.
antediluvian	Of or relating to the period before the biblical flood. <i>Antediluvian</i> man.
antiquated	Old-fashioned or outdated. This <b>antiquated</b> central heating system.
<u>archaic</u>	So extremely old as seeming to belong to an earlier period. A term with a rather <b>archaic</b> ring to it.
<u>brother</u>	A male with the same parents as someone else. <i>The time is coming <b>brother</b>s for us to act.</i>
<u>daughter</u>	A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source. <i>We are the sons and <b>daughter</b>s of Adam</i> .
family	The children of a person or couple being discussed. The <b>family</b> refused to accept his will.
father	Treat with the protective care associated with a father. A singular letter from a lady requesting I would <b>father</b> a novel of hers.
forebear	An ancestor. Generations of his <b>forebear</b> s had lived in London.
forefather	Person from an earlier time who contributed to the tradition shared by some group. The <b>forefather</b> s of modern British socialism.
gramps	The father of your father or mother.
grandfather	The person who founded or originated something. Smokers who worked here before the ban have been <b>grandfather</b> ed.
grandma	The mother of your father or mother. <i>Grandma</i> didn't stop talking.
grandmother	The mother of your father or mother. My <b>grandmother</b> is ill.
grandpa	The father of your father or mother.
grandparent	A parent of your father or mother. It must be a great blessing to have Chloe s <b>grandparent</b> s living nearby.



moot	Open to argument or debate. That is a <b>moot</b> question.
obsolescent	Becoming obsolete. <i>Obsolescent</i> equipment.
<u>obsolete</u>	Cause a product or idea to become obsolete by replacing it with something new. <b>Obsolete</b> words.
outdated	Old; no longer valid or fashionable. <i>Outdated equipment</i> .
paleolithic	Second part of the Stone Age beginning about 750,00 to 500,000 years BC and lasting until the end of the last ice age about 8,500 years BC. <i>Paleolithic artifacts.</i>
patriarch	A bishop of one of the most ancient Christian sees (Alexandria, Antioch, Constantinople, Jerusalem, and formerly Rome). <i>He s the <b>patriarch</b> of all spin doctors.</i>
<u>senior</u>	A student in one of the higher forms of a senior school. The people <b>senior</b> to me in my department.
<u>sister</u>	A fellow woman seen in relation to feminist issues. My <b>sister</b> married a musician.
superannuated	Outdated or obsolete through age or new developments. He left the house for the support of twelve <b>superannuated</b> wool carders.
uncle	A pawnbroker. He visited his <b>uncle</b> .
yore	Time long past.
