Definitions of "Electronic" as an adjective

- *Relating to electrons.*
- *(of music) produced by electronic instruments.*
- *Of or relating to electronics; concerned with or using devices that operate on principles governing the behavior of electrons.*
- *(of a device) having or operating with components such as microchips and transistors that control and direct electric currents.*
- *Carried out or accessed by means of a computer or other electronic device, especially over a network.*
- *Relating to electronics.*
- *Of or concerned with electrons.*



Synonyms of "Electronic" as an adjective (7 Words)

automated	Operated by automation. <i>A fully automated process.</i>
computerized	(of information) converted to a form that is stored or processed by computer. <i>The advantages of computerized accounting.</i>
<u>mechanical</u>	Relating to or governed by or in accordance with mechanics. <i>A mechanical device.</i>
mechanized	Operated by or equipped with machines; having undergone a process of mechanization. <i>Hip hop with a mechanized beat.</i>
preprogrammed	(of an electronic device) having been programmed in advance. <i>The drones are designed to follow a preprogrammed route at the push of a button.</i>

robotic

Resembling or characteristic of a robot, especially in being stiff or unemotional.

A **robotic** device for performing surgery.

unmanned

Lacking a crew.

An **unmanned** level crossing.

anode	The negatively charged terminal of a voltaic cell or storage battery that supplies current.
biochemistry	The processes and substances with which the science of biochemistry is concerned. <i>Abnormal brain biochemistry.</i>
<u>bonding</u>	The placement of dutiable goods in bond. <i>Scientific principles such as chemical bonding or the workings of jet propulsion.</i>
cathode	The positively charged electrode of an electrical device, such as a primary cell, that supplies current.
<u>computer</u>	A machine for performing calculations automatically.
device	Something in an artistic work designed to achieve a particular effect. <i>A device intended to conserve water.</i>

<u>digital</u>	Relating to using or storing data or information in the form of digital signals. <i>Digital computer.</i>
electricity	Energy made available by the flow of electric charge through a conductor. <i>They built a car that runs on electricity.</i>
electrify	Equip for use with electricity. <i>Electrify an appliance.</i>
electrode	A conductor used to make electrical contact with some part of a circuit.
electrolysis	The removal of hair roots or small blemishes on the skin by the application of heat using an electric current.
electron	An elementary particle with negative charge.
<u>engineering</u>	The branch of science and technology concerned with the design, building, and use of engines, machines, and structures. <i>Software engineering.</i>
equipment	The process of supplying someone or something with necessary equipment. <i>They lacked the intellectual equipment to recognize the jokes.</i>
insulation	The act of protecting something by surrounding it with material that reduces or prevents the transmission of sound or heat or electricity. <i>The insulation of England was preserved by the English Channel.</i>
keyboard	Enter data by means of a keyboard. <i>Keyboarding is an important job skill.</i>
laptop	A portable computer small enough to use in your lap.
lithium	Lithium carbonate or another lithium salt used as a mood stabilizing drug.
machine	Make or operate on with a machine. <i>The party's fund raising is helping it to build a formidable political machine.</i>
<u>mechanical</u>	Using (or as if using) mechanisms or tools or devices. <i>Mechanical skills.</i>
<u>mechanics</u>	The branch of physics concerned with the motion of bodies in a frame of reference. <i>The mechanics of prose style.</i>
microprocessor	Integrated circuit semiconductor chip that performs the bulk of the processing and controls the parts of a system. <i>A microprocessor functions as the central processing unit of a microcomputer.</i>

neutrino	A neutral subatomic particle with a mass close to zero and half integral spin which rarely reacts with normal matter Three kinds of neutrinos are known associated with the electron muon and tau particle.
photoelectric	Of or pertaining to photoelectricity. Photoelectric <i>detection systems.</i>
science	A particular area of science. <i>His rare science and his practical skill.</i>
semiconductor	A solid substance that has a conductivity between that of an insulator and that of most metals either due to the addition of an impurity or because of temperature effects Devices made of semiconductors notably silicon are essential components of most electronic circuits.
synthesizer	An intellectual who synthesizes or uses synthetic methods.
typewriter	A machine with keys for producing alphabetical characters, numerals, and typographical symbols one at a time on paper inserted round a roller.
welding	Fastening two pieces of metal together by softening with heat and applying pressure.
wireless	Transmission by radio waves. Wireless <i>broadband.</i>
