- *(of a device) having or operating with components such as microchips and transistors that control and direct electric currents.*
- *Carried out or accessed by means of a computer or other electronic device, especially over a network.*
- *Relating to electronics.*
- *Of or concerned with electrons.*

- mechanized** Operated by or equipped with machines; having undergone a process of mechanization.  
*Hip hop with a **mechanized** beat.*

Resembling or characteristic of a robot, especially in being stiff or unemotional.

A **robotic** device for performing surgery.

**unmanned**

Lacking a crew.

An **unmanned** level crossing.

<b>anode</b>	The negatively charged terminal of a voltaic cell or storage battery that supplies current.
<b>biochemistry</b>	The processes and substances with which the science of biochemistry is concerned. <i>Abnormal brain <b>biochemistry</b>.</i>
<b><u>bonding</u></b>	The placement of dutiable goods in bond. <i>Scientific principles such as chemical <b>bonding</b> or the workings of jet propulsion.</i>
<b>cathode</b>	The positively charged electrode of an electrical device, such as a primary cell, that supplies current.
<b><u>computer</u></b>	A machine for performing calculations automatically.
<b>device</b>	Something in an artistic work designed to achieve a particular effect. <i>A <b>device</b> intended to conserve water.</i>

<b>digital</b>	Relating to using or storing data or information in the form of digital signals. <i>Digital</i> computer.
<b>electricity</b>	Energy made available by the flow of electric charge through a conductor. <i>They built a car that runs on <b>electricity</b>.</i>
<b>electrify</b>	Equip for use with electricity. <i>Electrify</i> an appliance.
<b>electrode</b>	A conductor used to make electrical contact with some part of a circuit.
<b>electrolysis</b>	The removal of hair roots or small blemishes on the skin by the application of heat using an electric current.
<b>electron</b>	An elementary particle with negative charge.
<b>engineering</b>	The branch of science and technology concerned with the design, building, and use of engines, machines, and structures. <i>Software <b>engineering</b>.</i>
<b>equipment</b>	The process of supplying someone or something with necessary equipment. <i>They lacked the intellectual <b>equipment</b> to recognize the jokes.</i>
<b>insulation</b>	The act of protecting something by surrounding it with material that reduces or prevents the transmission of sound or heat or electricity. <i>The <b>insulation</b> of England was preserved by the English Channel.</i>
<b>keyboard</b>	Enter data by means of a keyboard. <i><b>Keyboarding</b> is an important job skill.</i>
<b>laptop</b>	A portable computer small enough to use in your lap.
<b>lithium</b>	Lithium carbonate or another lithium salt used as a mood stabilizing drug.
<b>machine</b>	Make or operate on with a machine. <i>The party's fund raising is helping it to build a formidable political <b>machine</b>.</i>
<b>mechanical</b>	Using (or as if using) mechanisms or tools or devices. <i><b>Mechanical</b> skills.</i>
<b>mechanics</b>	The branch of physics concerned with the motion of bodies in a frame of reference. <i>The <b>mechanics</b> of prose style.</i>
<b>microprocessor</b>	Integrated circuit semiconductor chip that performs the bulk of the processing and controls the parts of a system. <i>A <b>microprocessor</b> functions as the central processing unit of a microcomputer.</i>

<b>neutrino</b>	A neutral subatomic particle with a mass close to zero and half integral spin which rarely reacts with normal matter Three kinds of neutrinos are known associated with the electron muon and tau particle.
<b>photoelectric</b>	Of or pertaining to photoelectricity. <b>Photoelectric</b> <i>detection systems.</i>
<b>science</b>	A particular area of science. <i>His rare <b>science</b> and his practical skill.</i>
<b>semiconductor</b>	A solid substance that has a conductivity between that of an insulator and that of most metals either due to the addition of an impurity or because of temperature effects Devices made of semiconductors notably silicon are essential components of most electronic circuits.
<b>synthesizer</b>	An intellectual who synthesizes or uses synthetic methods.
<b>typewriter</b>	A machine with keys for producing alphabetical characters, numerals, and typographical symbols one at a time on paper inserted round a roller.
<b>welding</b>	Fastening two pieces of metal together by softening with heat and applying pressure.
<b>wireless</b>	Transmission by radio waves. <b>Wireless</b> <i>broadband.</i>
