| <b>bison</b>     | A humpbacked shaggy-haired wild ox native to North America and Europe.   |

| <b>carnivore</b> | A person who is not a vegetarian.<br><i>Tyrannosaurus Rex was a large <b>carnivore</b>.</i>  |
| <b>cat</b>       | Beat with a cat o nine tails.<br><i>A marbled <b>cat</b>.</i>  |
| <b>cheetah</b>   | Long-legged spotted cat of Africa and southwestern Asia having nonretractile claws; the swiftest mammal; can be trained to run down game.                          |
| <b>eagle</b>     | A figure of an eagle especially as a symbol of the US.<br><i>He <b>eagled</b> the last to share fourth place.</i>  |
| <b>giraffe</b>   | A large African mammal with a very long neck and forelegs, having a coat patterned with brown patches separated by lighter lines. It is the tallest living animal. |
| <b>hawk</b>      | Used in names of hawkmoths e g eyed hawk.<br><i>Swifts <b>hawked</b> low over the water.</i>   |
| <b>horn</b>      | A device having the shape of a horn.<br><i>The cleat had two <b>horns</b>.</i>   |
| <b>leopard</b>   | Spotted like a leopard.<br><i>A <b>leopard</b> print outfit.</i>   |
| <b>lion</b>      | The lion as an emblem e g of English or Scottish royalty or as a charge in heraldry.   |
| <b>mammalian</b> | Relating to or denoting a mammal.<br><i><b>Mammalian</b> cells.</i>  |
| <b>mane</b>      | Growth of hair covering the scalp of a human being.<br><i>The horse was rushing about in the field tossing its <b>mane</b>.</i>                                    |

| <b>monkey</b>     | A person who is dominated or controlled by another with reference to the monkey traditionally kept by an organ grinder.<br><i>I saw them <b>monkeying</b> about by the shop.</i>  |
| <b>omnivore</b>   | A person who eats all kinds of foods.   |
| <b>ostrich</b>    | A person who refuses to face reality or recognize the truth a reference to the popular notion that the ostrich hides from danger by burying its head in the sand.<br><i>Don't be an <b>ostrich</b> when it comes to security systems.</i> |
| <b>owl</b>        | Nocturnal bird of prey with hawk-like beak and claws and large head with front-facing eyes.   |
| <b>pachyderm</b>  | A very large mammal with thick skin, especially an elephant, rhinoceros, or hippopotamus.   |
| <b>panther</b>    | A leopard in the black color phase.   |
| <b>parrot</b>     | Repeat mechanically.<br><i>The students <b>parroted</b> the teacher's words.</i>  |
| <b>poach</b>      | Cook in a simmering liquid.<br><i>People are <b>poaching</b> elephants for their ivory.</i>   |
| <b>predator</b>   | A company that tries to take over another.<br><i>Females defend the nest by actively chasing off <b>predators</b>.</i>  |
| <b>quail</b>      | Flesh of quail suitable for roasting or broiling if young otherwise must be braised.  |
| <b>raven</b>      | Feed greedily.<br><i>Thick <b>raven</b> hair.</i>   |
| <b>rhinoceros</b> | A large, heavily built plant-eating mammal with one or two horns on the nose and thick folded skin, native to Africa and southern Asia. All kinds have become endangered through hunting.   |
| <b>tail</b>       | The rear part of an aeroplane with the tailplane and rudder.<br><i>A catering truck at the <b>tail</b> of the convoy.</i>   |
| <b>tiger</b>      | Used in names of tiger moths and striped butterflies e.g. scarlet tiger plain tiger.<br><i>He's a <b>tiger</b> on the tennis court.</i>   |
| <b>tusk</b>       | A hard smooth ivory colored dentine that makes up most of the tusks of elephants and walrus.<br><i><b>Tusk</b> an elephant.</i>   |
| <b>vulture</b>    | Someone who attacks in search of booty.<br><i>The press are <b>vultures</b>.</i>  |
