## Associations of "Elitist" (30 Words)

<b>academic</b>	Hypothetical or theoretical and not expected to produce an immediate or practical result. <i>An <b>academic</b> question.</i>
<a href="#">aristocracy</a>	A state in which governing power is held by the nobility. <i>Members of the <b>aristocracy</b>.</i>
<b>aristocrat</b>	A member of the aristocracy. <i>The trout is the <b>aristocrat</b> of freshwater fish.</i>
<a href="#">aristocratic</a>	Belonging to or characteristic of the nobility or aristocracy. <i><b>Aristocratic</b> government.</i>
<a href="#">arrogant</a>	Having or revealing an exaggerated sense of one’s own importance or abilities. <i>An <b>arrogant</b> official.</i>
<a href="#">brag</a>	Exceptionally good. <i>They were <b>bragging</b> about how easy it had been.</i>
<b>burgess</b>	A member of the assembly of colonial Maryland or Virginia.
<b>cocksure</b>	Confident in an excessive or arrogant way. <i>The <b>cocksure</b> golf prodigy from California.</i>
<a href="#">condescending</a>	(used of behavior or attitude) characteristic of those who treat others with condescension. <i>She thought the teachers were arrogant and <b>condescending</b>.</i>
<b>dignity</b>	A composed or serious manner or style. <i>He bowed with great <b>dignity</b>.</i>
<b>elite</b>	A group or class of people seen as having the most power and influence in a society, especially on account of their wealth or privilege. <i>The country's governing <b>elite</b>.</i>
<b>elitism</b>	The superior attitude or behaviour associated with an elite. <i>Local government in the nineteenth century was the very essence of <b>elitism</b>.</i>

<b>esquire</b>	A young nobleman who, in training for knighthood, acted as an attendant to a knight. <i>J. C. Pearson <b>Esquire</b>.</i>
<b>gentry</b>	People of good social position, specifically the class of people next below the nobility in position and birth. <i>A member of the landed <b>gentry</b>.</i>
<b><u>haughty</u></b>	Arrogantly superior and disdainful. <i><b>Haughty</b> aristocrats.</i>
<b>highbrow</b>	A highbrow person. <i>She considered all those without television as <b>highbrows</b> intellectual snobs or paupers.</i>
<b><u>intellectual</u></b>	Possessing a highly developed intellect. <i>Coldly <b>intellectual</b>.</i>
<b>intelligentsia</b>	Intellectuals or highly educated people as a group, especially when regarded as possessing culture and political influence. <i>The belief that the liberal <b>intelligentsia</b> is ruining the country.</i>
<b><u>nobility</u></b>	A privileged class holding hereditary titles. <i>A man of <b>nobility</b> and learning.</i>
<b>patrician</b>	A member of a noble family or class in ancient Rome. <i>A <b>patrician</b> nose.</i>
<b>patronize</b>	Assume sponsorship of. <i>Restaurants and bars regularly <b>patronized</b> by the stars were often crowded with paparazzi.</i>
<b>peerage</b>	Peers as a class. <i>On his retirement as cabinet secretary he was given a <b>peerage</b>.</i>
<b>plutocracy</b>	An elite or ruling class whose power derives from their wealth. <i>Officials were drawn from the new <b>plutocracy</b>.</i>
<b><u>pride</u></b>	The best state of something; the prime. <i>He <b>prides</b> himself on making it into law school.</i>
<b>racist</b>	A person with a prejudiced belief that one race is superior to others. <i><b>Racist</b> remarks.</i>
<b><u>royal</u></b>	A member of the royal family. <i>Of <b>royal</b> ancestry.</i>
<b>royalty</b>	Payment to the holder of a patent or copyright or resource for the right to use their property. <i>It s not often you meet real Hollywood <b>royalty</b> let alone chat to Angelina Jolie and Dustin Hoffman in one day.</i>

**ruling**

The reason for a court's judgment (as opposed to the decision itself).  
*The **ruling** was reversed in the appeal court.*

**snob**

A person who believes that their tastes in a particular area are superior to those of other people.

*Her mother was a **snob** and wanted a lawyer as a son in law.*

**superciliousness**

The trait of displaying arrogance by patronizing those considered inferior.
