### **Definitions of "Elongated" as an adjective**

- *Drawn out or made longer spatially.*
- *Having notably more length than width; being long and slender.*
- *Long in relation to width, especially unusually so.*

- elongate** Long in relation to width elongated.  
*The old man s gaunt and **elongated** frame.*
- extended** Fully extended or stretched forth.  
*Surgeons with **extended** experience.*
- lengthened** Drawn out or made longer spatially.  
***Lengthened** skirts are fashionable this year.*

**prolonged** Drawn out or made longer spatially.  
*The region suffered a **prolonged** drought.*

<b>aggrandize</b>	Add details to. <i>He hoped to <b>aggrandize</b> himself by dying a hero's death.</i>
<b>bloat</b>	Make bloated or swollen. <i>The fungus has <b>bloated</b> their abdomens.</i>
<b>detour</b>	Travel via a detour. <i>He <b>detoured</b> around the walls.</i>
<b>elongate</b>	Long in relation to width elongated. <i>The pup's globular body slowly <b>elongates</b>.</i>
<b>expand</b>	Expand the influence of. <i><b>Expand</b> the house by adding another wing.</i>
<b>expanded</b>	Increased in extent or size or bulk or scope. <i>The <b>expanded</b> fins of the ray.</i>

<b>expansion</b>	The action of becoming larger or more extensive. <i>The rapid <b>expansion</b> of suburban London.</i>
<b><u>extend</u></b>	Continue or extend. <i>He really <b>extended</b> himself when he climbed Kilimanjaro.</i>
<b>extended</b>	Fully extended or stretched forth. <i><b>Extended</b> farm lands.</i>
<b>extensible</b>	Able to be extended or stretched; extendable. <i>Silk is an exceptionally strong <b>extensible</b> and tough material.</i>
<b><u>flexible</u></b>	Able to adjust readily to different conditions. <i><b>Flexible</b> schedules.</i>
<b>horizontally</b>	In a horizontal position or direction. <i>Labels are placed <b>horizontally</b> on the cases.</i>
<b><u>length</u></b>	The length of a horse boat etc as a measure of the lead in a race. <i>The <b>length</b> of the waiting list.</i>
<b>lengthen</b>	Make or become longer. <i>In Spring the days <b>lengthen</b>.</i>
<b>lengthy</b>	Relatively long in duration; tediously protracted. <i>A <b>lengthy</b> visit from her mother in law.</i>
<b><u>long</u></b>	Assets held in a long position. <i>A week <b>long</b> course.</i>
<b>outreach</b>	Stretch out one's arms. <i>The growth of evangelistic <b>outreach</b>.</i>
<b>outstretched</b>	Fully extended especially in length. <i>A kitten with one paw <b>outstretched</b>.</i>
<b>prolongation</b>	The consequence of being lengthened in duration. <i>The position is advertised for two years but <b>prolongation</b> is possible.</i>
<b><u>prolonged</u></b>	Continuing for a long time or longer than usual; lengthy. <i>A <b>prolonged</b> and bitter struggle.</i>
<b>protract</b>	Prolong. <i>He had certainly taken his time even <b>protracting</b> the process.</i>
<b>protracted</b>	Relatively long in duration tediously protracted. <i><b>Protracted</b> negotiations.</i>
<b>rod</b>	A square rod of land. <i>Over a hundred <b>rods</b> turned out for the day including some famous names.</i>
<b>spread</b>	Become distributed or widespread. <i>With arms <b>spread</b> wide.</i>

- stretch** Make long or longer by pulling and stretching.  
*My budget won't **stretch** to a weekend at a health farm.*
- stretched** Extended or spread over a wide area or distance.  
*Well **stretched** muscles are less susceptible to injury.*
- stretching** Exercise designed to extend the limbs and muscles to their full extent.  
Lose thickness become thin or thinner.
- thin** *Their effect in **thinning** the ozone layer is probably slowing the global warming trend.*
- unfold** (of events or information) gradually develop or be revealed.  
*There was a fascinating scene **unfolding** before me.*
- widen** Extend in scope or range or area.  
***Widen** the road.*
