- *Drawn out or made longer spatially.*
- *Having notably more length than width; being long and slender.*
- *Long in relation to width, especially unusually so.*

- elongate** Long in relation to width elongated.
*The old man s gaunt and **elongated** frame.*
- extended** Fully extended or stretched forth.
*Surgeons with **extended** experience.*
- lengthened** Drawn out or made longer spatially.
***Lengthened** skirts are fashionable this year.*

prolonged Drawn out or made longer spatially.
*The region suffered a **prolonged** drought.*

aggrandize	Add details to. <i>He hoped to aggrandize himself by dying a hero's death.</i>
bloat	Make bloated or swollen. <i>The fungus has bloated their abdomens.</i>
detour	Travel via a detour. <i>He detoured around the walls.</i>
elongate	Long in relation to width elongated. <i>The pup's globular body slowly elongates.</i>
expand	Expand the influence of. <i>Expand the house by adding another wing.</i>
expanded	Increased in extent or size or bulk or scope. <i>The expanded fins of the ray.</i>

expansion	The action of becoming larger or more extensive. <i>The rapid expansion of suburban London.</i>
<u>extend</u>	Continue or extend. <i>He really extended himself when he climbed Kilimanjaro.</i>
extended	Fully extended or stretched forth. <i>Extended farm lands.</i>
extensible	Able to be extended or stretched; extendable. <i>Silk is an exceptionally strong extensible and tough material.</i>
<u>flexible</u>	Able to adjust readily to different conditions. <i>Flexible schedules.</i>
horizontally	In a horizontal position or direction. <i>Labels are placed horizontally on the cases.</i>
<u>length</u>	The length of a horse boat etc as a measure of the lead in a race. <i>The length of the waiting list.</i>
lengthen	Make or become longer. <i>In Spring the days lengthen.</i>
lengthy	Relatively long in duration; tediously protracted. <i>A lengthy visit from her mother in law.</i>
<u>long</u>	Assets held in a long position. <i>A week long course.</i>
outreach	Stretch out one's arms. <i>The growth of evangelistic outreach.</i>
outstretched	Fully extended especially in length. <i>A kitten with one paw outstretched.</i>
prolongation	The consequence of being lengthened in duration. <i>The position is advertised for two years but prolongation is possible.</i>
<u>prolonged</u>	Continuing for a long time or longer than usual; lengthy. <i>A prolonged and bitter struggle.</i>
protract	Prolong. <i>He had certainly taken his time even protracting the process.</i>
protracted	Relatively long in duration tediously protracted. <i>Protracted negotiations.</i>
rod	A square rod of land. <i>Over a hundred rods turned out for the day including some famous names.</i>
spread	Become distributed or widespread. <i>With arms spread wide.</i>

stretch	Make long or longer by pulling and stretching. <i>My budget won't stretch to a weekend at a health farm.</i>
stretched	Extended or spread over a wide area or distance. <i>Well stretched muscles are less susceptible to injury.</i>
stretching	Exercise designed to extend the limbs and muscles to their full extent.
thin	Lose thickness become thin or thinner. <i>Their effect in thinning the ozone layer is probably slowing the global warming trend.</i>
unfold	(of events or information) gradually develop or be revealed. <i>There was a fascinating scene unfolding before me.</i>
widen	Extend in scope or range or area. <i>Widen the road.</i>
