stretch Make long or longer by pulling and stretching.

My budget won t **stretch** to a weekend at a health farm.

stretched Extended or spread over a wide area or distance.

Well **stretched** muscles are less susceptible to injury.

stretching Exercise designed to extend the limbs and muscles to their full extent.

Lose thickness become thin or thinner.

thin Their effect in **thin**ning the ozone layer is probably slowing the global

warming trend.

unfold (of events or information) gradually develop or be revealed.

widen Extend in scope or range or area.
