Associations of "Eluded" (30 Words)

apophasis	Mentioning something by saying it will not be mentioned.
avert	Prevent the occurrence of; prevent from happening. <i>Talks failed to avert a rail strike.</i>
avoid	Refrain from certain foods or beverages. <i>This route avoids downtown Boston.</i>
bypass	An alternative channel created during a bypass operation. <i>The town has been bypassed.</i>
circumvent	Deceive; outwit. <i>He circumvented her with some of his stories.</i>
deflect	(of an object) change direction after hitting something. <i>The ball deflected off Knight's body.</i>
derail	Cause (a train or tram) to leave its tracks accidentally. <i>They had planned to derail the trains that carried atomic waste.</i>
detour	Avoid by taking a detour. <i>I would detour the endless stream of motor homes.</i>
dodge	(of a bell in change-ringing) move one place contrary to the normal sequence, and then back again in the following round. <i>The grant system's widespread use as a tax dodge.</i>
escape	Be incomprehensible to escape understanding by. <i>He drove along the dual carriageway to escape police.</i>
eschew	Deliberately avoid using; abstain from. <i>He appealed to the crowd to eschew violence.</i>
evade	Escape paying (tax or duty), especially by illegitimate presentation of one's finances. <i>This difficult idea seems to evade her.</i>
fast	Unwavering in devotion to friend or vow or cause. <i>The journey was fast and enjoyable.</i>

flee	Run away from a place or situation of danger. <i>He was forced to flee the country.</i>
forfend	Protect (something) by precautionary measures. <i>The sacrifice of Mississippi was forfended against even the treason of Wilkinson.</i>
hint	Drop a hint intimate by a hint. <i>A hint mockery in her manner.</i>
horrified	Stricken with horror. <i>The horrified spectators.</i>
migrant	Tending to migrate or having migrated. <i>Appalled by the social conditions of migrant life.</i>
oncoming	Due to happen soon. <i>The oncoming winter.</i>
ostracize	(in ancient Greece) banish (an unpopular or overly powerful citizen) from a city for five or ten years by popular vote. <i>Ever since I spoke up my colleagues ostracize me.</i>
outrun	Run faster than. <i>Their one chance was to outrun their pursuers.</i>
parry	An act of parrying something. <i>Her question met with a polite parry.</i>
quick	At a fast rate quickly. <i>Quick of foot.</i>
refugee	A person who has been forced to leave their country in order to escape war, persecution, or natural disaster. <i>A refugee camp.</i>
shambles	A butcher's slaughterhouse (archaic except in place names). <i>The shambles where the animals were slaughtered.</i>
shun	Avoid and stay away from deliberately; stay clear of. <i>He shunned fashionable society.</i>
sidestep	Avoid (someone or something) by stepping sideways. <i>A boxercise workout that incorporates an intricate combination of sidesteps with left and right hooks.</i>
undiagnosed	Not diagnosed or having been subject to diagnosis. <i>Some patients have diseases that go undiagnosed and therefore untreated.</i>
veer	(of the wind) change direction clockwise around the points of the compass. <i>The wind veered a point.</i>
