## Associations of "Eluded" (30 Words)

<b>apophysis</b>	Mentioning something by saying it will not be mentioned.
<b>avert</b>	Prevent the occurrence of; prevent from happening. <i>Talks failed to <b>avert</b> a rail strike.</i>
<b>avoid</b>	Refrain from certain foods or beverages. <i>This route <b>avoids</b> downtown Boston.</i>
<b>bypass</b>	An alternative channel created during a bypass operation. <i>The town has been <b>bypassed</b>.</i>
<b>circumvent</b>	Deceive; outwit. <i>He <b>circumvented</b> her with some of his stories.</i>
<b>deflect</b>	(of an object) change direction after hitting something. <i>The ball <b>deflected</b> off Knight's body.</i>
<b>derail</b>	Cause (a train or tram) to leave its tracks accidentally. <i>They had planned to <b>derail</b> the trains that carried atomic waste.</i>
<b>detour</b>	Avoid by taking a detour. <i>I would <b>detour</b> the endless stream of motor homes.</i>
<b>dodge</b>	(of a bell in change-ringing) move one place contrary to the normal sequence, and then back again in the following round. <i>The grant system's widespread use as a tax <b>dodge</b>.</i>
<b>escape</b>	Be incomprehensible to escape understanding by. <i>He drove along the dual carriageway to <b>escape</b> police.</i>
<b>eschew</b>	Deliberately avoid using; abstain from. <i>He appealed to the crowd to <b>eschew</b> violence.</i>
<b>evade</b>	Escape paying (tax or duty), especially by illegitimate presentation of one's finances. <i>This difficult idea seems to <b>evade</b> her.</i>
<b>fast</b>	Unwavering in devotion to friend or vow or cause. <i>The journey was <b>fast</b> and enjoyable.</i>

<b>flee</b>	Run away from a place or situation of danger. <i>He was forced to <b>flee</b> the country.</i>
<b>forfend</b>	Protect (something) by precautionary measures. <i>The sacrifice of Mississippi was <b>forfended</b> against even the treason of Wilkinson.</i>
<b>hint</b>	Drop a hint intimate by a hint. <i>A <b>hint</b> mockery in her manner.</i>
<b>horrified</b>	Stricken with horror. <i>The <b>horrified</b> spectators.</i>
<b>migrant</b>	Tending to migrate or having migrated. <i>Appalled by the social conditions of <b>migrant</b> life.</i>
<b>oncoming</b>	Due to happen soon. <i>The <b>oncoming</b> winter.</i>
<b>ostracize</b>	(in ancient Greece) banish (an unpopular or overly powerful citizen) from a city for five or ten years by popular vote. <i>Ever since I spoke up my colleagues <b>ostracize</b> me.</i>
<b>outrun</b>	Run faster than. <i>Their one chance was to <b>outrun</b> their pursuers.</i>
<b>parry</b>	An act of parrying something. <i>Her question met with a polite <b>parry</b>.</i>
<b>quick</b>	At a fast rate quickly. <i><b>Quick</b> of foot.</i>
<b>refugee</b>	A person who has been forced to leave their country in order to escape war, persecution, or natural disaster. <i>A <b>refugee</b> camp.</i>
<b>shambles</b>	A butcher's slaughterhouse (archaic except in place names). <i>The <b>shambles</b> where the animals were slaughtered.</i>
<b>shun</b>	Avoid and stay away from deliberately; stay clear of. <i>He <b>shunned</b> fashionable society.</i>
<b>sidestep</b>	Avoid (someone or something) by stepping sideways. <i>A boxercise workout that incorporates an intricate combination of <b>sidesteps</b> with left and right hooks.</i>
<b>undiagnosed</b>	Not diagnosed or having been subject to diagnosis. <i>Some patients have diseases that go <b>undiagnosed</b> and therefore untreated.</i>
<b>veer</b>	(of the wind) change direction clockwise around the points of the compass. <i>The wind <b>veered</b> a point.</i>
