## Associations of "Emanating" (30 Words)

<b>arise</b>	Take part in a rebellion; renounce a former allegiance. <i>New difficulties had <b>arisen</b>.</i>
<b>begin</b>	Be the first item or point constitute the beginning or start come first in a series. <i>Words <b>beginning</b> with a vowel.</i>
<b>beginning</b>	The place where something begins, where it springs into being. <i>They had reached the <b>beginning</b> of the wood.</i>
<b>cause</b>	Cause to do cause to act in a specified manner. <i>The <b>cause</b> of the accident is not clear.</i>
<a href="#">commence</a>	Get off the ground. <i>His design team <b>commenced</b> work.</i>
<a href="#">commencement</a>	A ceremony in which degrees or diplomas are conferred on university or high-school students. <i>The date of <b>commencement</b>.</i>
<b>derive</b>	(of a sentence in a natural language) be linked by a set of stages to (its underlying logical form). <i>Words whose spelling <b>derives</b> from Dr Johnson s incorrect etymology.</i>
<b>develop</b>	Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development. <i>The child <b>developed</b> beautifully in her new kindergarten.</i>
<a href="#">emit</a>	Express audibly; utter sounds (not necessarily words). <i>Even the best cars <b>emit</b> carbon dioxide.</i>
<a href="#">exhale</a>	Give out (breath or an odor). <i>She sat back and <b>exhaled</b> deeply.</i>
<b>exude</b>	Release (a liquid) in drops or small quantities. <i>The beetle <b>exudes</b> a caustic liquid.</i>

<b>fume</b>	Expose something especially wood to ammonia fumes in order to produce dark tints. <i>The minister reportedly <b>fumed</b> at officials of the department.</i>
<b>germinal</b>	Containing seeds of later development. <i>A <b>germinal</b> idea.</i>
<b>inaugurate</b>	Commence officially. <i>He <b>inaugurated</b> a new policy of trade and exploration.</i>
<b><u>inception</u></b>	The establishment or starting point of an institution or activity. <i>She has been on the board since its <b>inception</b> two years ago.</i>
<b><u>incipient</u></b>	(of a person) developing into a specified type or role. <i>An <b>incipient</b> tumor.</i>
<b>initiate</b>	A person who has been initiated into an organization or activity. <i>They were <b>initiated</b> into the mysteries of mathematics.</i>
<b>launch</b>	An act or instance of launching something. <i>The <b>launch</b> of a new campaign against drinking and driving.</i>
<b><u>ooze</u></b>	Release (a liquid) in drops or small quantities. <i>She <b>oozes</b> a raunchy sex appeal.</i>
<b><u>origin</u></b>	The more fixed end or attachment of a muscle. <i>The name is Norse in <b>origin</b>.</i>
<b><u>originate</u></b>	Begin a trip at a certain point, as of a plane, train, bus, etc. <i>The word <b>originated</b> as a marketing term.</i>
<b><u>radiate</u></b>	Experience a feeling of well-being or happiness, as from good health or an intense emotion. <i>The <b>radiate</b> crown.</i>
<b>radioactive</b>	Exhibiting or caused by radioactivity. <i><b>Radioactive</b> isotope.</i>
<b>ray</b>	Emit as rays. <i>The <b>ray</b> that runs from the centre of the circle to the point of tangency.</i>
<b>release</b>	A document effecting a release of property money etc. <i>She <b>released</b> his arm and pushed him aside.</i>
<b>smoke</b>	Inhale and exhale the smoke produced by burning a narcotic drug. <i>Do you <b>smoke</b>.</i>
<b>source</b>	Obtain from a particular source. <i>Each type of coffee is <b>sourced</b> from one country.</i>
<b>start</b>	A turn to be a starter in a game at the beginning. <i>The woman gave a nervous <b>start</b>.</i>

**stirring**

Agitating a liquid with an implement.

*Constant **stirring** prevents it from burning on the bottom of the pan.*

**trailblazer**

Someone who helps to open up a new line of research or technology or art.

*He was a **trailblazer** for many ideas that are now standard fare.*
