Associations of "Emanating" (30 Words)

arise	Take part in a rebellion; renounce a former allegiance. <i>New difficulties had arisen.</i>
begin	Be the first item or point constitute the beginning or start come first in a series. <i>Words beginning with a vowel.</i>
beginning	The place where something begins, where it springs into being. <i>They had reached the beginning of the wood.</i>
cause	Cause to do cause to act in a specified manner. <i>The cause of the accident is not clear.</i>
commence	Get off the ground. <i>His design team commenced work.</i>
commencement	A ceremony in which degrees or diplomas are conferred on university or high-school students. <i>The date of commencement.</i>
derive	(of a sentence in a natural language) be linked by a set of stages to (its underlying logical form). <i>Words whose spelling derives from Dr Johnson s incorrect etymology.</i>
develop	Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development. <i>The child developed beautifully in her new kindergarten.</i>
emit	Express audibly; utter sounds (not necessarily words). <i>Even the best cars emit carbon dioxide.</i>
exhale	Give out (breath or an odor). <i>She sat back and exhaled deeply.</i>
exude	Release (a liquid) in drops or small quantities. <i>The beetle exudes a caustic liquid.</i>

fume	Expose something especially wood to ammonia fumes in order to produce dark tints. <i>The minister reportedly fumed at officials of the department.</i>
germinal	Containing seeds of later development. <i>A germinal idea.</i>
inaugurate	Commence officially. <i>He inaugurated a new policy of trade and exploration.</i>
<u>inception</u>	The establishment or starting point of an institution or activity. <i>She has been on the board since its inception two years ago.</i>
<u>incipient</u>	(of a person) developing into a specified type or role. <i>An incipient tumor.</i>
initiate	A person who has been initiated into an organization or activity. <i>They were initiated into the mysteries of mathematics.</i>
launch	An act or instance of launching something. <i>The launch of a new campaign against drinking and driving.</i>
<u>ooze</u>	Release (a liquid) in drops or small quantities. <i>She oozes a raunchy sex appeal.</i>
<u>origin</u>	The more fixed end or attachment of a muscle. <i>The name is Norse in origin.</i>
<u>originate</u>	Begin a trip at a certain point, as of a plane, train, bus, etc. <i>The word originated as a marketing term.</i>
<u>radiate</u>	Experience a feeling of well-being or happiness, as from good health or an intense emotion. <i>The radiate crown.</i>
radioactive	Exhibiting or caused by radioactivity. <i>Radioactive isotope.</i>
ray	Emit as rays. <i>The ray that runs from the centre of the circle to the point of tangency.</i>
release	A document effecting a release of property money etc. <i>She released his arm and pushed him aside.</i>
smoke	Inhale and exhale the smoke produced by burning a narcotic drug. <i>Do you smoke.</i>
source	Obtain from a particular source. <i>Each type of coffee is sourced from one country.</i>
start	A turn to be a starter in a game at the beginning. <i>The woman gave a nervous start.</i>

stirring

Agitating a liquid with an implement.

*Constant **stirring** prevents it from burning on the bottom of the pan.*

trailblazer

Someone who helps to open up a new line of research or technology or art.

*He was a **trailblazer** for many ideas that are now standard fare.*
