
Embarrassed as an Adjective

abashed Feeling or caused to feel ill at ease or self-conscious or ashamed.

Felt **abashed** at the extravagant praise.

awkward Difficult to handle or manage especially because of shape.

You have put me in a very **awkward** position.

Blushing

Red in the face from shyness, embarrassment, or shame.

The blushing boy was brought before the Principal.

chagrined Feeling or caused to feel ill at ease or self-conscious or ashamed.

Chagrined at the poor sales of his book.

humiliated Made to feel uncomfortable because of shame or wounded pride.

Humiliated that his wife had to go out to work.

mortified Made to feel uncomfortable because of shame or wounded pride.

Felt **mortified** by the comparison with her sister.

red-faced Reddened or suffused with or as if with blood from emotion or exertion.



self-conscious Excessively and uncomfortably conscious of your appearance or behavior.

Showing or feeling embarrassment from shame or a lack of self-

confidence. sheepish

A sheepish grin.

Less than; short of. shy


A **shy** smile.
