Definitions of "Emblem" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “emblem” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A visible symbol representing an abstract idea.*
- *A thing serving as a symbol of a particular quality or concept.*
- *A heraldic device or symbolic object as a distinctive badge of a nation, organization, or family.*
- *Special design or visual object representing a quality, type, group, etc.*



Synonyms of "Emblem" as a noun (9 Words)

allegory

A story, poem, or picture that can be interpreted to reveal a hidden meaning, typically a moral or political one.

*Pilgrim s Progress is an **allegory** of the spiritual journey.*

figure

A unitary percept having structure and coherence that is the object of attention and that stands out against a ground.

*The **figure** 7.*

image

An iconic mental representation.

*He s the **image** of his father.*

mark

A marking that consists of lines that cross each other.

*They figure I m an easy **mark**.*

representation

Formal statements made to an authority, especially so as to communicate an opinion or register a protest.

*A striking **representation** of a vase of flowers.*

sign	A fundamental linguistic unit linking a signifier to that which is signified de Saussure. <i>Charges of opposite sign.</i>
symbol	A mark or character used as a conventional representation of an object, function, or process, e.g. the letter or letters standing for a chemical element or a character in musical notation. <i>The Red Cross symbol.</i>
token	A metal or plastic disc used to operate a machine or in exchange for particular goods or services. <i>I wanted to offer you a small token of my appreciation.</i>
type	Metal types used in letterpress printing. <i>The capable type.</i>



Usage Examples of "Emblem" as a noun

- *Our child would be a dazzling emblem of our love.*
- *America's national emblem, the bald eagle.*



Associations of "Emblem" (30 Words)

- ampersand** A punctuation mark (&) used to represent conjunction (and).
- blazon** The official symbols of a family, state, etc.
*They saw their company name **blazoned** all over the media.*
- caret** A mark (^, ¶) placed below the line to indicate a proposed insertion in a text.
- contingent** Subject to chance.
*That men are living creatures is a **contingent** fact.*
- denotation** The act of indicating or pointing out by name.
*Beyond their immediate **denotation** the words have a connotative power.*
- elective** Subject to popular election.
*An **elective** course of study.*

embodiment	A concrete representation of an otherwise nebulous concept. <i>She seemed to be a living embodiment of vitality.</i>
embody	Be an expression of or give a tangible or visible form to (an idea, quality, or feeling). <i>Livius embodied the population of the town.</i>
epitomize	Give a summary of (a written work). <i>For the benefit of our readers we will epitomize the pamphlet.</i>
exemplify	Illustrate or clarify by giving an example. <i>The best dry sherry is exemplified by the fino of Jerez.</i>
express	By express. <i>He expressed complete satisfaction.</i>
flag	Flagpole used to mark the position of the hole on a golf green. <i>Problems often flag the need for organizational change.</i>
glyph	A hieroglyphic character or symbol. <i>These glyphs refer to an ancient Olmec ruler.</i>
heraldic	Indicative of or announcing something to come. <i>Heraldic devices.</i>
incarnate	(of a person) be the living embodiment of (a quality). <i>Here is capitalism incarnate.</i>
logo	A symbol or other small design adopted by an organization to identify its products, uniform, vehicles, etc. <i>The Olympic logo was emblazoned across the tracksuits.</i>
mascot	A person or animal that is adopted by a team or other group as a symbolic figure. <i>The team's dolphin mascot.</i>
national	A national newspaper as opposed to a local one. <i>National forests.</i>
pennant	A flag denoting a sports championship or other achievement. <i>The Dodgers won six pennants during his career.</i>
portray	Portray in words. <i>The book portrayed him as a self-serving careerist.</i>
represent	Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody's interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute. <i>We cannot represent this knowledge to our formal reason.</i>

representative	Of a government or political system based on elected or chosen representatives. <i>Free elections and representative democracy.</i>
sign	A gesture that is part of a sign language. <i>A sign of the Zodiac.</i>
stereotype	Treat or classify according to a mental stereotype. <i>Sexual and racial stereotypes.</i>
symbol	Symbolize. <i>The chemical symbol for helium is He.</i>
symbolic	Relating to or using or proceeding by means of symbols. <i>Klimt's symbolic painting of 1900.</i>
symbolism	The practice of investing things with symbolic meaning. <i>The old fashioned symbolism of flowers.</i>
symbolize	Represent by means of symbols. <i>What does the Statue of Liberty symbolize.</i>
typify	Express indirectly by an image, form, or model; be a symbol. <i>Tough, low-lying vegetation typifies this arctic area.</i>
zodiac	A circular diagram representing the 12 zodiacal constellations and showing their signs.
