## **Emblem as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Emblem" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “emblem” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A visible symbol representing an abstract idea.*
- *A thing serving as a symbol of a particular quality or concept.*
- *A heraldic device or symbolic object as a distinctive badge of a nation, organization, or family.*
- *Special design or visual object representing a quality, type, group, etc.*



## Synonyms of "Emblem" as a noun (9 Words)

### allegory

A story, poem, or picture that can be interpreted to reveal a hidden meaning, typically a moral or political one.

*Pilgrim s Progress is an **allegory** of the spiritual journey.*

### **figure**

A unitary percept having structure and coherence that is the object of attention and that stands out against a ground.

*The **figure** 7.*

### image

An iconic mental representation.

*He s the **image** of his father.*

### **mark**

A marking that consists of lines that cross each other.

*They figure I m an easy **mark**.*

### **representation**

Formal statements made to an authority, especially so as to communicate an opinion or register a protest.

*A striking **representation** of a vase of flowers.*

<b>sign</b>	A fundamental linguistic unit linking a signifier to that which is signified de Saussure. <i>Charges of opposite <b>sign</b>.</i>
<b>symbol</b>	A mark or character used as a conventional representation of an object, function, or process, e.g. the letter or letters standing for a chemical element or a character in musical notation. <i>The Red Cross <b>symbol</b>.</i>
<b>token</b>	A metal or plastic disc used to operate a machine or in exchange for particular goods or services. <i>I wanted to offer you a small <b>token</b> of my appreciation.</i>
<b>type</b>	Metal types used in letterpress printing. <i>The capable <b>type</b>.</i>



### Usage Examples of "Emblem" as a noun

- *Our child would be a dazzling emblem of our love.*
- *America's national emblem, the bald eagle.*





## Associations of "Emblem" (30 Words)

<b>ampersand</b>	A punctuation mark (&) used to represent conjunction (and).
<b>blazon</b>	The official symbols of a family, state, etc. <i>They saw their company name <b>blazoned</b> all over the media.</i>
<b>caret</b>	A mark (^, ¶) placed below the line to indicate a proposed insertion in a text.
<b>contingent</b>	Subject to chance. <i>That men are living creatures is a <b>contingent</b> fact.</i>
<b>denotation</b>	The act of indicating or pointing out by name. <i>Beyond their immediate <b>denotation</b> the words have a connotative power.</i>
<b>elective</b>	Subject to popular election. <i>An <b>elective</b> course of study.</i>

<b>embodiment</b>	A concrete representation of an otherwise nebulous concept. <i>She seemed to be a living <b>embodiment</b> of vitality.</i>
<b>embody</b>	Be an expression of or give a tangible or visible form to (an idea, quality, or feeling). <i>Livius embodied the population of the town.</i>
<b>epitomize</b>	Give a summary of (a written work). <i>For the benefit of our readers we will <b>epitomize</b> the pamphlet.</i>
<b>exemplify</b>	Illustrate or clarify by giving an example. <i>The best dry sherry is exemplified by the fino of Jerez.</i>
<b>express</b>	By express. <i>He <b>expressed</b> complete satisfaction.</i>
<b>flag</b>	Flagpole used to mark the position of the hole on a golf green. <i>Problems often <b>flag</b> the need for organizational change.</i>
<b>glyph</b>	A hieroglyphic character or symbol. <i>These <b>glyphs</b> refer to an ancient Olmec ruler.</i>
<b>heraldic</b>	Indicative of or announcing something to come. <i><b>Heraldic</b> devices.</i>
<b>incarnate</b>	(of a person) be the living embodiment of (a quality). <i>Here is capitalism <b>incarnate</b>.</i>
<b>logo</b>	A symbol or other small design adopted by an organization to identify its products, uniform, vehicles, etc. <i>The Olympic <b>logo</b> was emblazoned across the tracksuits.</i>
<b>mascot</b>	A person or animal that is adopted by a team or other group as a symbolic figure. <i>The team's dolphin <b>mascot</b>.</i>
<b>national</b>	A national newspaper as opposed to a local one. <i><b>National</b> forests.</i>
<b>pennant</b>	A flag denoting a sports championship or other achievement. <i>The Dodgers won six <b>pennants</b> during his career.</i>
<b>portray</b>	Portray in words. <i>The book <b>portrayed</b> him as a self-serving careerist.</i>
<b>represent</b>	Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody's interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute. <i>We cannot <b>represent</b> this knowledge to our formal reason.</i>

<b>representative</b>	Of a government or political system based on elected or chosen representatives. <i>Free elections and <b>representative</b> democracy.</i>
<b>sign</b>	A gesture that is part of a sign language. <i>A <b>sign</b> of the Zodiac.</i>
<b>stereotype</b>	Treat or classify according to a mental stereotype. <i>Sexual and racial <b>stereotypes</b>.</i>
<b>symbol</b>	Symbolize. <i>The chemical <b>symbol</b> for helium is He.</i>
<b>symbolic</b>	Relating to or using or proceeding by means of symbols. <i>Klimt's <b>symbolic</b> painting of 1907.</i>
<b>symbolism</b>	The practice of investing things with symbolic meaning. <i>The old fashioned <b>symbolism</b> of flowers.</i>
<b>symbolize</b>	Represent by means of symbols. <i>What does the Statue of Liberty <b>symbolize</b>.</i>
<b>typify</b>	Express indirectly by an image, form, or model; be a symbol. <i>Tough, low-lying vegetation <b>typifies</b> this arctic area.</i>
<b>zodiac</b>	A circular diagram representing the 12 zodiacal constellations and showing their signs.
