### **Definitions of "Emblem" as a noun**

- *A thing serving as a symbol of a particular quality or concept.*
- *A heraldic device or symbolic object as a distinctive badge of a nation, organization, or family.*
- *Special design or visual object representing a quality, type, group, etc.*



## Synonyms of "Emblem" as a noun (9 Words)

### allegory

A story, poem, or picture that can be interpreted to reveal a hidden meaning, typically a moral or political one.

*Pilgrim s Progress is an **allegory** of the spiritual journey.*

### **figure**

A unitary percept having structure and coherence that is the object of attention and that stands out against a ground.

*The **figure** 7.*

### image

An iconic mental representation.

*He s the **image** of his father.*

### **mark**

A marking that consists of lines that cross each other.

*They figure I m an easy **mark**.*

### **representation**

Formal statements made to an authority, especially so as to communicate an opinion or register a protest.

*A striking **representation** of a vase of flowers.*

| <b>exemplify</b>  | Illustrate or clarify by giving an example.<br><i>The best dry sherry is exemplified by the fino of Jerez.</i>   |
| <b>express</b>    | By express.<br><i>He <b>expressed</b> complete satisfaction.</i>   |
| <b>flag</b>       | Flagpole used to mark the position of the hole on a golf green.<br><i>Problems often <b>flag</b> the need for organizational change.</i>   |
| <b>glyph</b>      | A hieroglyphic character or symbol.<br><i>These <b>glyphs</b> refer to an ancient Olmec ruler.</i>   |
| <b>heraldic</b>   | Indicative of or announcing something to come.<br><i><b>Heraldic</b> devices.</i>  |
| <b>incarnate</b>  | (of a person) be the living embodiment of (a quality).<br><i>Here is capitalism <b>incarnate</b>.</i>  |
| <b>logo</b>       | A symbol or other small design adopted by an organization to identify its products, uniform, vehicles, etc.<br><i>The Olympic <b>logo</b> was emblazoned across the tracksuits.</i>  |
| <b>mascot</b>     | A person or animal that is adopted by a team or other group as a symbolic figure.<br><i>The team's dolphin <b>mascot</b>.</i>  |
| <b>national</b>   | A national newspaper as opposed to a local one.<br><i><b>National</b> forests.</i>   |
| <b>pennant</b>    | A flag denoting a sports championship or other achievement.<br><i>The Dodgers won six <b>pennants</b> during his career.</i>   |
| <b>portray</b>    | Portray in words.<br><i>The book <b>portrayed</b> him as a self-serving careerist.</i>   |
| <b>represent</b>  | Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody's interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute.<br><i>We cannot <b>represent</b> this knowledge to our formal reason.</i> |
