bodied	Having a body or trunk, typically of a specified kind. <i>Big bodied.</i>
corporal	Affecting or characteristic of the body as opposed to the mind or spirit. <i>What seemed corporal melted as breath into the wind.</i>
corporate	Possessing or existing in bodily form- Shakespeare. <i>Local authorities like other corporate bodies may reduce capital spending.</i>
incarnate	(especially of a deity or spirit) embodied in human form. <i>A monarch regarded as a god incarnate.</i>

<u>archetype</u>	A very typical example of a certain person or thing. <i>An instrument which was the archetype of the early flute.</i>
<u>cognition</u>	A perception sensation idea or intuition resulting from the process of cognition.
<u>conceptual</u>	Being or characterized by concepts or their formation. <i>Philosophy deals with conceptual difficulties.</i>
<u>configuration</u>	An arrangement of parts or elements in a particular form, figure, or combination. <i>The PC comes with a removable hard disk drive as part of the standard configuration.</i>
contents	A list of divisions (chapters or articles) and the pages on which they start. <i>He emptied the contents of his pockets.</i>
<u>corporeal</u>	Having a body. <i>That which is created is of necessity corporeal and visible and tangible.</i>
form	An ability to perform well. <i>To form a judgement he seeks further information.</i>
formation	A group of people or things in a particular arrangement or pattern. <i>The formation of the Great Rift Valley.</i>
<u>frame</u>	The framework for a pair of eyeglasses. <i>He claims he was framed.</i>
framework	An essential supporting structure of a building, vehicle, or object. <i>Providing a factual framework for future research.</i>
idea	A mental impression. <i>It s a good idea to do some research before you go.</i>
lattice	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. <i>A lattice fence.</i>
<u>metaphor</u>	A figure of speech in which a word or phrase is applied to an object or action to which it is not literally applicable. <i>Her poetry depends on suggestion and metaphor.</i>
model	Plan or create according to a model or models. <i>The company revealed their latest model at the Motor Show.</i>
morphological	Relating to the form or structure of things. <i>The language s phonological morphological and syntactic structure.</i>
<u>morphology</u>	A particular form, shape, or structure. <i>Grammar is organized along two main dimensions morphology and syntax.</i>

oblong	Having the shape of an oblong. <i>Oblong tables.</i>
poser	A person who poses for a photographer or painter or sculptor.
<u>shape</u>	Shape or influence give direction to. <i>He could barely make out their shapes.</i>
simulate	Create a representation or model of. <i>Future population changes were simulated by computer.</i>
simulation	Imitation of a situation or process. <i>A simulation should imitate the internal processes and not merely the results of the thing being simulated.</i>
<u>skeleton</u>	A sport in which a competitor races down a frozen track on a skeleton sled. <i>The skeleton s runners make a terrifying rumbling sound as they slide down the ice.</i>
spheroid	A solid generated by a half revolution of an ellipse about its major axis prolate spheroid or minor axis oblate spheroid. <i>It looked like a sphere but on closer examination I saw it was really a spheroid.</i>
structure	Give a structure to. <i>We shall use three headings to give some structure to the discussion.</i>
symbolism	A system of symbols and symbolic representations. <i>The old fashioned symbolism of flowers.</i>
template	Something that serves as a model for others to copy. <i>Secondary structure in the template strand is eliminated.</i>
topic	The subject matter of a conversation or discussion. <i>Sleep deprivation became a frequent topic of conversation.</i>
triangle	A percussion instrument consisting of a metal bar bent in the shape of an open triangle. <i>A small triangle of grass.</i>
visualization	The representation of an object, situation, or set of information as a chart or other image. <i>A powerful visualization of a future dystopia.</i>
