- *Represent in bodily form.*

be	Be priced at. <i>He s a tough customer let him be.</i>
body forth	Invest with or as with a body; give body to.
incarnate	Embody or represent (a deity or spirit) in human form. <i>A desire to make things which will incarnate their personality.</i>
personify	Represent or embody (a quality, concept, etc.) in a physical form. <i>Public pageants and dramas in which virtues and vices were personified.</i>
substantiate	Solidify, firm, or strengthen. <i>The painting substantiates the feelings of the artist.</i>

Associations of "Embodies" (30 Words)

ampersand	The sign & (standing for and, as in Smith & Co., or the Latin et, as in &c.).
<u>asterisk</u>	Mark a word or piece of text with an asterisk. <i>He had asterisked the things about the case that still bothered him.</i>
<u>bookmark</u>	A record of the address of a website, file, or other data made to enable quick access in future. <i>Fans will want to bookmark this site.</i>
caret	A mark used by an author or editor to indicate where something is to be inserted into a text.
comma	A widespread butterfly that has orange and brown wings with ragged edges and a white comma shaped mark on the underside of the hindwing.
<u>connotation</u>	An idea or feeling which a word invokes for a person in addition to its literal or primary meaning. <i>The work functions both by analogy and by connotation.</i>
cue	Give a cue to or for. <i>My teacher joked about such attitudes and I followed her cue.</i>
denotation	The act of indicating or pointing out by name. <i>Beyond their immediate denotation the words have a connotative power.</i>
diacritical	Capable of distinguishing.
<u>emblem</u>	A thing serving as a symbol of a particular quality or concept. <i>America's national emblem the bald eagle.</i>
embodiment	A concrete representation of an otherwise nebulous concept. <i>The embodiment of hope.</i>
<u>exclamation</u>	An abrupt excited utterance. <i>She gave an exclamation of delight.</i>
<u>exemplify</u>	Be a typical example of. <i>He exemplified his point with an anecdote.</i>
incarnate	(especially of a deity or spirit) embodied in human form. <i>A desire to make things which will incarnate their personality.</i>
<u>index</u>	Adjust through indexation. <i>Exam results may serve as an index of the teacher's effectiveness.</i>
indicant	Something that serves to indicate or suggest. <i>Symptoms are the prime indicants of disease.</i>
indication	A symptom that suggests certain medical treatment is necessary. <i>There were indications that it was time to leave.</i>

<u>manifestation</u>	An event, action, or object that clearly shows or embodies something abstract or theoretical. <i>The butterfly was one of the many manifestations of the Goddess.</i>
mark	A figure or letter representing the total number of marks awarded in an examination or competition and signifying a person's score. <i>Few bullets could have missed their mark.</i>
mascot	A person or thing that is supposed to bring good luck, especially one linked to a particular organization or event. <i>The team's dolphin mascot.</i>
punctuate	Insert punctuation marks into. <i>Her sharp questions punctuated the speaker's drone.</i>
punctuation	The marks, such as full stop, comma, and brackets, used in writing to separate sentences and their elements and to clarify meaning. <i>You will notice that no punctuation is used.</i>
represent	Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody's interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute. <i>The flower represents a young girl.</i>
sign	Communicate silently and non verbally by signals or signs. <i>Things haven't changed since I signed in the summer.</i>
<u>signify</u>	Convey or express a meaning. <i>What does his strange behavior signify.</i>
<u>symbol</u>	Symbolize. <i>The chemical symbol for helium is He.</i>
<u>symbolic</u>	Serving as a symbol. <i>Klimt's symbolic painting of 1900 7.</i>
symptom	(medicine) any sensation or change in bodily function that is experienced by a patient and is associated with a particular disease. <i>Dental problems may be a symptom of other illness.</i>
<u>tag</u>	Attach a tag or label to. <i>Pieces of DNA tagged with radioactive particles.</i>
zodiac	A representation of the signs of the zodiac or of a similar astrological system.
