<b>aboveground</b>	On or above the surface of the ground. <i><b>Aboveground</b> nuclear testing.</i>
<b>appear</b>	Appear as a character on stage or appear in a play etc. <i>The paperback edition didn't <b>appear</b> for another two years.</i>
<b>ascertain</b>	Learn or discover with certainty. <i>Management should <b>ascertain</b> whether adequate funding can be provided.</i>
<b>betide</b>	Become of; happen to. <i>I waited with beating heart not knowing what would <b>betide</b>.</i>
<b>blur</b>	Make unclear indistinct or blurred. <i>The haze <b>blurs</b> the hills.</i>
<b>depict</b>	Give a description of. <i>These equations may be <b>depicted</b> on a graph.</i>
<b>emerging</b>	Coming to maturity. <i>Established and <b>emerging</b> artists.</i>
<b>espy</b>	Catch sight of. <i>She <b>espied</b> her daughter rounding the corner.</i>
<b>evinced</b>	Reveal the presence of (a quality or feeling); indicate. <i>The news stories <b>evinced</b> the usual mixture of sympathy and satisfaction.</i>
<b>externalize</b>	Regard as objective. <i>An urgent need to <b>externalize</b> the experience.</i>
<b>find</b>	The finding of a fox. <i>I can't <b>find</b> my keys.</i>
<b>fixate</b>	Cause (someone) to develop an obsessive attachment to someone or something. <i>An individual may have been <b>fixated</b> at one stage of development.</i>
<b>look</b>	An expression of a feeling or thought by looking. <i>She is <b>looking</b> to a promotion.</i>

<b>loom</b>	Weave on a loom. <i>Another air plane <b>loomed</b> into the sky.</i>
<b>observing</b>	Quick to notice; showing quick and keen perception.
<b>peek</b>	Look quickly or furtively. <i>I only <b>peeked</b> I didn't see anything interesting.</i>
<b>peep</b>	Cause to appear. <i>He <b>peeped</b> at the woman through the window.</i>
<b>phantasm</b>	A ghostly appearing figure. <i>Every <b>phantasm</b> of a hope was quickly nullified.</i>
<b>predominate</b>	Having superior power and influence. <i>The huge sculpture <b>predominates</b> over the fountain.</i>
<b>see</b>	See or watch. <i>He is blind he cannot <b>see</b>.</i>
<b>seem</b>	Seem to be true probable or apparent. <i>I <b>seem</b> to remember giving you very precise instructions.</i>
<b>show</b>	Show in or as in a picture. <i>The youth soon <b>showed</b> himself a canny batsman.</i>
<b>smug</b>	Marked by excessive complacency or self-satisfaction. <i>He was feeling <b>smug</b> after his win.</i>
<b>superficial</b>	Occurring on or near the surface of the skin. <i><b>Superficial</b> facial injuries.</i>
<b>surface</b>	Come to the surface. <i><b>Surface</b> mail.</i>
<b>testify</b>	Provide evidence for. <i>The bleak lines <b>testify</b> to inner torment.</i>
<b>visit</b>	A meeting arranged by the visitor to see someone such as a doctor or lawyer for treatment or advice. <i>He went out to <b>visit</b> with his pals.</i>
<b>visual</b>	Visible. <i><b>Visual</b> navigation.</i>
<b>visually</b>	In a way that relates to seeing or sight. <i>A <b>visually</b> stunning film.</i>
<b>witness</b>	Be a witness to. <i>The memorial service was <b>witness</b> to the wide circle of his interests.</i>
