observing	Quick to notice; showing quick and keen perception.
<u>peek</u>	Look quickly or furtively. I only peek ed I didn t see anything interesting.
реер	Cause to appear. He peep ed at the woman through the window.
phantasm	A ghostly appearing figure. Every phantasm of a hope was quickly nullified.
predominate	Having superior power and influence. <i>The huge sculpture predominates over the fountain.</i>
<u>see</u>	See or watch. He is blind he cannot see .
<u>seem</u>	Seem to be true probable or apparent. I seem to remember giving you very precise instructions.
show	Show in or as in a picture. The youth soon show ed himself a canny batsman.
<u>smug</u>	Marked by excessive complacency or self-satisfaction. <i>He was feeling smug after his win.</i>
<u>superficial</u>	Occurring on or near the surface of the skin. <i>Superficial</i> facial injuries.
<u>surface</u>	Come to the surface. <i>Surface</i> mail.
testify	Provide evidence for. The bleak lines testify to inner torment.
visit	A meeting arranged by the visitor to see someone such as a doctor or lawyer for treatment or advice. <i>He went out to visit with his pals.</i>
<u>visual</u>	Visible. <i>Visual</i> navigation.
visually	In a way that relates to seeing or sight. A visually stunning film.
witness	Be a witness to. The memorial service was witness to the wide circle of his interests.
