aboveground	On or above the surface of the ground. <i>Aboveground nuclear testing.</i>
appear	Appear as a character on stage or appear in a play etc. <i>The paperback edition didn't appear for another two years.</i>
ascertain	Learn or discover with certainty. <i>Management should ascertain whether adequate funding can be provided.</i>
betide	Become of; happen to. <i>I waited with beating heart not knowing what would betide.</i>
blur	Make unclear indistinct or blurred. <i>The haze blurs the hills.</i>
depict	Give a description of. <i>These equations may be depicted on a graph.</i>
emerging	Coming to maturity. <i>Established and emerging artists.</i>
espy	Catch sight of. <i>She espied her daughter rounding the corner.</i>
evinced	Reveal the presence of (a quality or feeling); indicate. <i>The news stories evinced the usual mixture of sympathy and satisfaction.</i>
externalize	Regard as objective. <i>An urgent need to externalize the experience.</i>
find	The finding of a fox. <i>I can't find my keys.</i>
fixate	Cause (someone) to develop an obsessive attachment to someone or something. <i>An individual may have been fixated at one stage of development.</i>
look	An expression of a feeling or thought by looking. <i>She is looking to a promotion.</i>

loom	Weave on a loom. <i>Another air plane loomed into the sky.</i>
observing	Quick to notice; showing quick and keen perception.
peek	Look quickly or furtively. <i>I only peeked I didn't see anything interesting.</i>
peep	Cause to appear. <i>He peeped at the woman through the window.</i>
phantasm	A ghostly appearing figure. <i>Every phantasm of a hope was quickly nullified.</i>
predominate	Having superior power and influence. <i>The huge sculpture predominates over the fountain.</i>
see	See or watch. <i>He is blind he cannot see.</i>
seem	Seem to be true probable or apparent. <i>I seem to remember giving you very precise instructions.</i>
show	Show in or as in a picture. <i>The youth soon showed himself a canny batsman.</i>
smug	Marked by excessive complacency or self-satisfaction. <i>He was feeling smug after his win.</i>
superficial	Occurring on or near the surface of the skin. <i>Superficial facial injuries.</i>
surface	Come to the surface. <i>Surface mail.</i>
testify	Provide evidence for. <i>The bleak lines testify to inner torment.</i>
visit	A meeting arranged by the visitor to see someone such as a doctor or lawyer for treatment or advice. <i>He went out to visit with his pals.</i>
visual	Visible. <i>Visual navigation.</i>
visually	In a way that relates to seeing or sight. <i>A visually stunning film.</i>
witness	Be a witness to. <i>The memorial service was witness to the wide circle of his interests.</i>
