## **Emergencies as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Emergencies" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “emergencies” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A state in which martial law applies.*
- *A sudden unforeseen crisis (usually involving danger) that requires immediate action.*
- *A brake operated by hand; usually operates by mechanical linkage.*



## Synonyms of "Emergencies" as a noun (5 Words)

- emergency brake** A sudden unforeseen crisis (usually involving danger) that requires immediate action.
- exigency** A sudden unforeseen crisis (usually involving danger) that requires immediate action.  
*The health care **exigency**.*
- hand brake** The (prehensile) extremity of the superior limb.
- parking brake** Space in which vehicles can be parked.
- pinch** An act of pinching someone.  
*The **pinch** of the recession.*



## Usage Examples of "Emergencies" as a noun

- *The governor declared a state of emergency.*
- *He never knew what to do in an emergency.*



## Associations of "Emergencies" (30 Words)

- ambulance** Convey in an ambulance.  
*He was **ambulanced** to accident and emergency.*
- bleeding** The flow of blood from a ruptured blood vessel.  
*She looks so **bleeding** bored all day.*
- brake** Stop travelling by applying a brake.  
*We had to **brake** suddenly when a chicken crossed the road.*
- contingency** A provision for a possible event or circumstance.  
*Stores were kept as a **contingency** against a blockade.*
- crisis** An unstable situation of extreme danger or difficulty.  
*After the **crisis** the patient either dies or gets better.*
- danger** A dangerous place.  
*The **dangers** of smoking.*
- dangerous** Able or likely to cause harm or injury.  
*A **dangerous** animal.*

<b><u>deliverance</u></b>	The action of being rescued or set free. <i>The low drawl he employed for such <b>deliverances</b>.</i>
<b>emergent</b>	An emergent tree or other plant. <i>An <b>emergent</b> republic.</i>
<b>entreaty</b>	Earnest or urgent request. <i>An <b>entreaty</b> to stop the fighting.</i>
<b>evacuate</b>	Remove (someone) from a place of danger to a safer place. <i>Patients <b>evacuated</b> their bowels before dialysis.</i>
<b>evacuation</b>	The bodily process of discharging waste matter. <i>Techniques for <b>evacuation</b> of gas combustion fumes.</i>
<b>exigency</b>	An urgent need or demand. <i>The health care <b>exigency</b>.</i>
<b><u>exigent</u></b>	Pressing; demanding. <i>Regarded literary questions as <b>exigent</b> and momentous.</i>
<b>firefighter</b>	A person whose job is to extinguish fires.
<b>fireman</b>	Play in which children pretend to put out a fire.
<b>hospital</b>	A medical institution where sick or injured people are given medical or surgical care. <i>Christ's <b>Hospital</b>.</i>
<b>immediate</b>	Immediately before or after as in a chain of cause and effect. <i>The <b>immediate</b> result.</i>
<b>immediately</b>	Without any intervening time or space. <i>I rang <b>immediately</b> for an ambulance.</i>
<b><u>imperative</u></b>	Relating to verbs in the imperative mood. <i>Immediate action was <b>imperative</b>.</i>
<b>inquest</b>	An inquiry by a coroner's court into the cause of a death. <i>An <b>inquest</b> by New York newspapers into a subway fire.</i>
<b><u>instant</u></b>	Instant coffee. <i>For an <b>instant</b> the moon disappeared.</i>
<b>medic</b>	A medical practitioner in the armed forces.
<b>paramedic</b>	A person trained to give emergency medical care to people who are injured or ill, typically in a setting outside a hospital. <i>A <b>paramedic</b> team was on its way.</i>
<b>pressing</b>	The act of pressing the exertion of pressure. <i>Pure grade olive oil is the product of the second or third <b>pressings</b>.</i>
<b><u>prioritize</u></b>	Designate or treat (something) as being very or most important. <i>The department has failed to <b>prioritize</b> safety within the oil industry.</i>

- suffocation** Difficulty in breathing.  
***Suffocation** by smoke inhalation.*
- tourniquet** A device for stopping the flow of blood through a vein or artery, typically by compressing a limb with a cord or tight bandage.
- urgency** An urgent situation calling for prompt action.  
*Emilia heard the **urgency** in his voice.*
- urgent** Of an action or event done or arranged in response to an urgent situation.  
*An **urgent** demand for more state funding.*
