## **Emigrant as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Emigrant" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “emigrant” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A person who leaves their own country in order to settle permanently in another.*
- *Someone who leaves one country to settle in another.*



## Synonyms of "Emigrant" as a noun (5 Words)

**emigre** Someone who leaves one country to settle in another.

**emigree** Someone who leaves one country to settle in another.

**outgoer** A person who or animal that goes out; specifically a person who goes out of a place, office, occupation, or tenancy; (Cricket) a dismissed batsman (now rare).

**stranger** A person who does not know, or is not known in, a particular place or community.

*He must have been a **stranger** to the village.*

**visitor** Someone who visits.

*The **visitors** came back into the game with two penalty goals.*



## Usage Examples of "Emigrant" as a noun

- *She was a Polish emigrant who came to Scotland during the Second World War.*





## Associations of "Emigrant" (30 Words)

<b>autonomous</b>	Having the freedom to act independently. <i>The spread of <b>autonomous</b> robotic weaponry.</i>
<b><u>city</u></b>	A town created a city by charter and usually containing a cathedral. <i>The <b>city</b> voted for Republicans in 1994.</i>
<b>community</b>	A particular area or place considered together with its inhabitants. <i>The preachers and the bootleggers found they had a <b>community</b> of interests.</i>

<u>country</u>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The whole <b>country</b> took to the streets.</i>
county	Relating to or characteristic of aristocratic people with an ancestral home in a particular county. <i>The <b>county</b> has a population of 12 345 people.</i>
diaspora	The dispersion of the Jewish people beyond Israel. <i>The <b>diaspora</b> of boat people from Asia.</i>
emigrate	Leave one's own country in order to settle permanently in another. <i>Rose s parents <b>emigrated</b> to Australia.</i>
emigration	The act of leaving one's own country to settle permanently in another; moving abroad. <i>Mass <b>emigration</b> from Ireland to the United States.</i>
expatriate	A person who is voluntarily absent from home or country. <i>People that have illegally <b>expatriated</b> funds.</i>
<u>frontier</u>	A line or border separating two countries. <i>He worked at the <b>frontier</b> of brain science.</i>
<u>ghetto</u>	A poor densely populated city district occupied by a minority ethnic group linked together by economic hardship and social restrictions. <i>The relative security of the gay <b>ghetto</b>.</i>
homeland	A person's or a people's native land. <i>They have been fighting for an independent <b>homeland</b> for nearly 30 years.</i>
jewish	Of or relating to Jews or their culture or religion.
<u>local</u>	A local train or bus service. <i>A <b>local</b> infection.</i>
municipal	Of or relating to the government of a municipality. <i><b>Municipal</b> offices.</i>
municipality	The governing body of a municipality. <i>Voters in each <b>municipality</b> choose between four candidates.</i>
<u>nation</u>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The news was announced to the <b>nation</b>.</i>
<u>national</u>	Owned or maintained for the public by the national government. <i>A <b>national</b> newspaper.</i>
<u>neighborhood</u>	People living near one another. <i>The price is in the <b>neighborhood</b> of 100.</i>
outskirts	Outlying areas (as of a city or town). <i>He built a new factory on the <b>outskirts</b> of Birmingham.</i>



<b><u>population</u></b>	All the inhabitants of a particular place. <i>Areas of sparse <b>population</b>.</i>
<b>populous</b>	Densely populated. <i>The <b>populous</b> city of Shanghai.</i>
<b>prefecture</b>	The office of prefect. <i>Enraged fans besieged the <b>Prefecture</b> of Police.</i>
<b><u>province</u></b>	A principal administrative division of a country or empire. <i>I made my way home to the dreary <b>provinces</b> by train.</i>
<b>resident</b>	Someone who lives at a particular place for a prolonged period or who was born there. <i><b>Resident</b> mute swans and wintering Bewick s swans.</i>
<b>scotland</b>	One of the four countries that make up the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland; located on the northern part of the island of Great Britain; famous for bagpipes and plaids and kilts.
<b><u>slum</u></b>	Spend time at a lower social level than one's own through curiosity or for charitable purposes. <i>Businessmen are having to <b>slum</b> it in aircraft economy class seats.</i>
<b>suburban</b>	Of or characteristic of a suburb. <i>Elizabeth despised Ann s house proudness as deeply <b>suburban</b>.</i>
<b><u>town</u></b>	The permanent residents of a university town. <i>He has moved to <b>town</b>.</i>
<b>underpopulated</b>	Having a lower population density than normal or desirable. <i>The richly endowed but <b>underpopulated</b> Ivory Coast.</i>
