<a href="#">ambassador</a>	An informal representative. <i>The French <b>ambassador</b> to Portugal.</i>
<b>attaché</b>	A specialist assigned to the staff of a diplomatic mission.
<b>consul</b>	An official appointed by a state to live in a foreign city and protect the state's citizens and interests there. <i>The British <b>consul</b> in Israel.</i>
<b>delegate</b>	A person appointed or elected to represent others. <i>Congress <b>delegates</b> rejected the proposals.</i>
<b>diplomat</b>	A person who can deal with others in a sensitive and tactful way.
<a href="#">envoy</a>	Someone sent on a mission to represent the interests of someone else. <i>A peace <b>envoy</b>.</i>
<b>legate</b>	A general or governor of an ancient Roman province, or their deputy. <i>A papal <b>legate</b> arrived in France on a peacemaking mission.</i>
<b>minister</b>	The job of a head of a government department. <i>The Angels are <b>ministers</b> of the Divine Will.</i>
<b>plenipotentiary</b>	A person, especially a diplomat, invested with the full power of independent action on behalf of their government, typically in a foreign country.



## Associations of "Emissary" (30 Words)

### abroad

Foreign countries considered collectively.  
*Millions of seeds are annually scattered **abroad**.*

### ambassador

An accredited diplomat sent by a state as its permanent representative in a foreign country.  
*He is a good **ambassador** for the industry.*

### **bargaining**

The negotiation of the terms of a transaction or agreement.

### colony

A group of people living in a colony consisting of the original settlers and their descendants and successors.  
*A nudist **colony**.*

### **commission**

A work produced in response to a commission.  
*The aircraft carrier was **commissioned** in 1945.*

<b><u>compromise</u></b>	Make a compromise arrive at a compromise. <i>The secret of a happy marriage is <b>compromise</b>.</i>
<b><u>concord</u></b>	Arrange the words of a text so as to create a concordance. <i>Both philosophers <b>concord</b> on this point.</i>
<b>consul</b>	A diplomat appointed by a government to protect its commercial interests and help its citizens in a foreign country. <i>The British <b>consul</b> in Israel.</i>
<b>consulate</b>	The period of office of a Roman consul. <i>He called at the <b>consulate</b> in Palestine to pick up a visa.</i>
<b><u>declaration</u></b>	A formal public statement. <i>The <b>declaration</b> of war.</i>
<b>devolution</b>	The delegation of authority (especially from a central to a regional government). <i>The <b>devolution</b> of the gentlemanly ideal into a glorification of drunkenness.</i>
<b>diplomat</b>	A person who deals tactfully with others.
<b>diplomatic</b>	Of or concerning diplomacy. <i>The hostess averted a confrontation with a <b>diplomatic</b> change of subject.</i>
<b>embassy</b>	The staff working in an embassy. <i>Worsley failed to be selected to join the <b>embassy</b> to Sweden.</i>
<b><u>envoy</u></b>	A brief stanza concluding certain forms of poetry. <i>A peace <b>envoy</b>.</i>
<b><u>foreign</u></b>	Dealing with or relating to other countries. <i><b>Foreign</b> currency.</i>
<b>mediate</b>	Connected indirectly through another person or thing involving an intermediate agency. <i>Structures which <b>mediate</b> gender divisions.</i>
<b><u>messenger</u></b>	Send a document or package by messenger. <i>Nitric oxide is an intercellular <b>messenger</b>.</i>
<b><u>nation</u></b>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The Shawnee <b>nation</b>.</i>
<b>negotiate</b>	Find a way over or through (an obstacle or difficult route). <i>He <b>negotiated</b> a new contract with the sellers.</i>
<b>official</b>	A person holding public office or having official duties especially as a representative of an organization or government department. <i>The golfer asked for an <b>official</b> who could give him a ruling.</i>

<b>pacification</b>	The act of appeasing someone or causing someone to be more favorably inclined. <i>A wonderful skill in the <b>pacification</b> of crying infants.</i>
<b>peace</b>	A treaty agreeing peace between warring states. <i>The Straits were to be open to warships in time of <b>peace</b>.</i>
<b>plenipotentiary</b>	A diplomat who is fully authorized to represent his or her government. <i>He went armed with <b>plenipotentiary</b> powers to take whatever measures he felt necessary.</i>
<b>rapprochement</b>	The reestablishing of cordial relations. <i>There were signs of a growing <b>rapprochement</b> between the two countries.</i>
<b>reconcilable</b>	Capable of being reconciled. <i>The theory was quite <b>reconcilable</b> with industrialization.</i>
<b>reconciliation</b>	The reestablishing of cordial relations. <i>The <b>reconciliation</b> of his checkbook and the bank statement.</i>
<b>representative</b>	Of a government or political system based on elected or chosen representatives. <i>A <b>representative</b> modern play.</i>
<b>settlement</b>	The property given under a settlement. <i>Inheritance tax could be due if you make a substantial gift or <b>settlement</b> and then die within the following seven years.</i>
<b>sinologist</b>	A student of Chinese history and language and culture.
