ambassador	An informal representative. <i>The French ambassador to Portugal.</i>
attaché	A specialist assigned to the staff of a diplomatic mission.
consul	An official appointed by a state to live in a foreign city and protect the state's citizens and interests there. <i>The British consul in Israel.</i>
delegate	A person appointed or elected to represent others. <i>Congress delegates rejected the proposals.</i>
diplomat	A person who can deal with others in a sensitive and tactful way.
envoy	Someone sent on a mission to represent the interests of someone else. <i>A peace envoy.</i>
legate	A general or governor of an ancient Roman province, or their deputy. <i>A papal legate arrived in France on a peacemaking mission.</i>
minister	The job of a head of a government department. <i>The Angels are ministers of the Divine Will.</i>
plenipotentiary	A person, especially a diplomat, invested with the full power of independent action on behalf of their government, typically in a foreign country.



Associations of "Emissary" (30 Words)

abroad

Foreign countries considered collectively.
*Millions of seeds are annually scattered **abroad**.*

ambassador

An accredited diplomat sent by a state as its permanent representative in a foreign country.
*He is a good **ambassador** for the industry.*

bargaining

The negotiation of the terms of a transaction or agreement.

colony

A group of people living in a colony consisting of the original settlers and their descendants and successors.
*A nudist **colony**.*

commission

A work produced in response to a commission.
*The aircraft carrier was **commissioned** in 1945.*

<u>compromise</u>	Make a compromise arrive at a compromise. <i>The secret of a happy marriage is compromise.</i>
<u>concord</u>	Arrange the words of a text so as to create a concordance. <i>Both philosophers concord on this point.</i>
consul	A diplomat appointed by a government to protect its commercial interests and help its citizens in a foreign country. <i>The British consul in Israel.</i>
consulate	The period of office of a Roman consul. <i>He called at the consulate in Palestine to pick up a visa.</i>
<u>declaration</u>	A formal public statement. <i>The declaration of war.</i>
devolution	The delegation of authority (especially from a central to a regional government). <i>The devolution of the gentlemanly ideal into a glorification of drunkenness.</i>
diplomat	A person who deals tactfully with others.
diplomatic	Of or concerning diplomacy. <i>The hostess averted a confrontation with a diplomatic change of subject.</i>
embassy	The staff working in an embassy. <i>Worsley failed to be selected to join the embassy to Sweden.</i>
<u>envoy</u>	A brief stanza concluding certain forms of poetry. <i>A peace envoy.</i>
<u>foreign</u>	Dealing with or relating to other countries. <i>Foreign currency.</i>
mediate	Connected indirectly through another person or thing involving an intermediate agency. <i>Structures which mediate gender divisions.</i>
<u>messenger</u>	Send a document or package by messenger. <i>Nitric oxide is an intercellular messenger.</i>
<u>nation</u>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The Shawnee nation.</i>
negotiate	Find a way over or through (an obstacle or difficult route). <i>He negotiated a new contract with the sellers.</i>
official	A person holding public office or having official duties especially as a representative of an organization or government department. <i>The golfer asked for an official who could give him a ruling.</i>

pacification	The act of appeasing someone or causing someone to be more favorably inclined. <i>A wonderful skill in the pacification of crying infants.</i>
peace	A treaty agreeing peace between warring states. <i>The Straits were to be open to warships in time of peace.</i>
plenipotentiary	A diplomat who is fully authorized to represent his or her government. <i>He went armed with plenipotentiary powers to take whatever measures he felt necessary.</i>
rapprochement	The reestablishing of cordial relations. <i>There were signs of a growing rapprochement between the two countries.</i>
reconcilable	Capable of being reconciled. <i>The theory was quite reconcilable with industrialization.</i>
reconciliation	The reestablishing of cordial relations. <i>The reconciliation of his checkbook and the bank statement.</i>
representative	Of a government or political system based on elected or chosen representatives. <i>A representative modern play.</i>
settlement	The property given under a settlement. <i>Inheritance tax could be due if you make a substantial gift or settlement and then die within the following seven years.</i>
sinologist	A student of Chinese history and language and culture.
