monarch

A sovereign head of state, especially a king, queen, or emperor.

*The reigning **monarch**.*

overlord

A ruler, especially a feudal lord.

*The Jews rebelled against their Roman **overlords**.*

potentate

A ruler who is unconstrained by law.

ruler

Measuring stick consisting of a strip of wood or metal or plastic with a straight edge that is used for drawing straight lines and measuring lengths.

saturnia pavonia

Large moth of temperate forests of Eurasia having heavily scaled transparent wings.

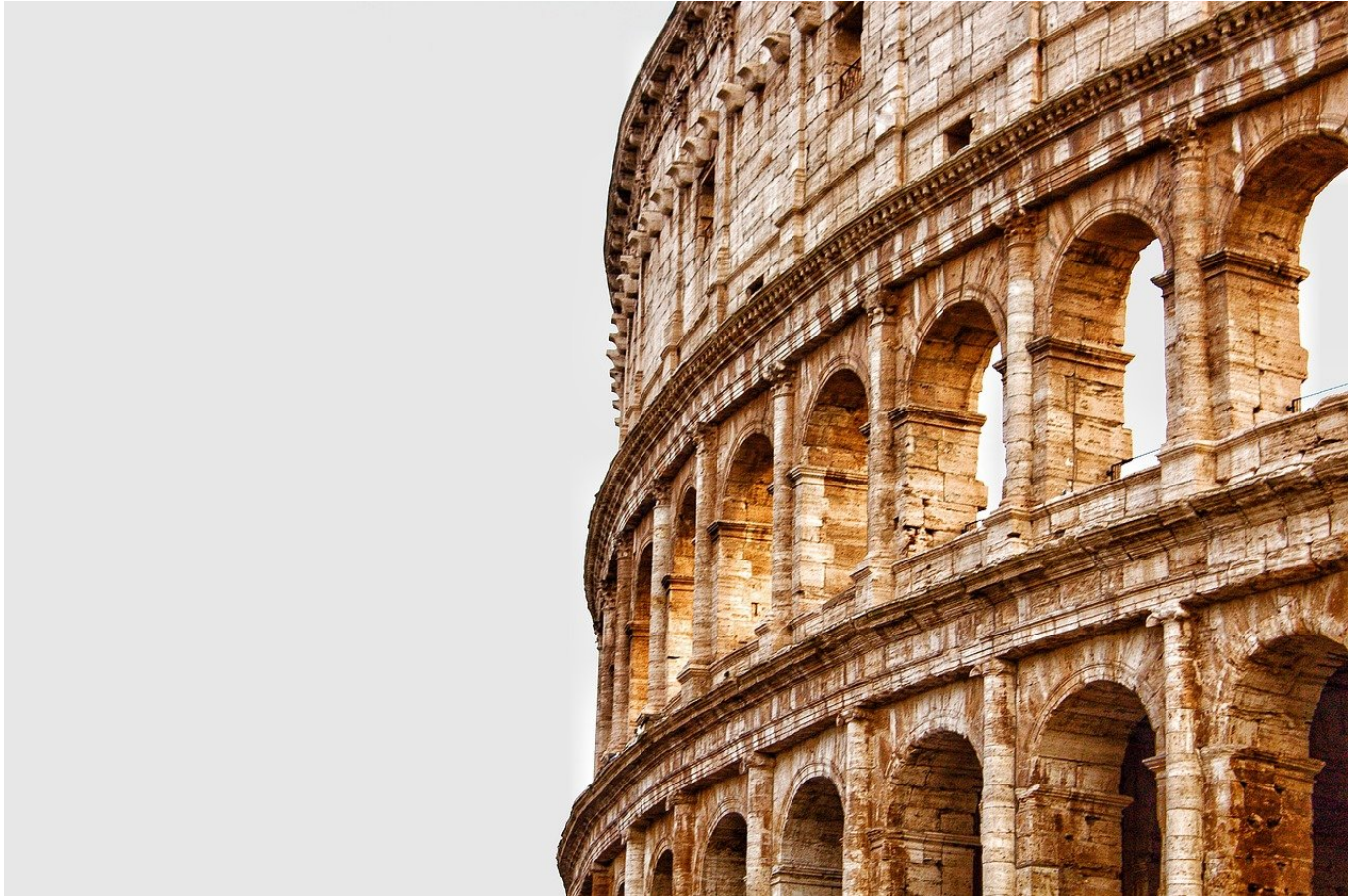
sovereign

A nation's ruler or head of state usually by hereditary right.
*The Emperor became the first Japanese **sovereign** to visit Britain.*

| incan | Of or pertaining to the Incas or their culture or empire. |
| <u>king</u> | Make someone king. <i>The lion is the king of beasts.</i> |
| <u>kingdom</u> | A monarchy with a king or queen as head of state. <i>The kingdom of dreams.</i> |
| liege | A feudal lord entitled to allegiance and service. <i>The Scots obeyed him as their liege lord.</i> |
| <u>lord</u> | Make a lord of someone. <i>When we were at school you used to lord it over us.</i> |
| monarchy | The monarch and royal family of a country. <i>The monarchy is the focus of loyalty and service.</i> |
| <u>palace</u> | A large and stately mansion. <i>The palace issued an order binding on all subjects.</i> |
| papal | Relating to a pope or to the papacy. <i>Papal dispensation.</i> |
| pontiff | The Pope. <i>The Pope s first visit to Poland as pontiff.</i> |
| pontifical | The vestments and other insignia of a pontiff (especially a bishop). <i>Pseudo scientific gobbledygook and pontifical hooey.</i> |
| pope | English poet and satirist (1688-1744). |
| prince | A male monarch of a small state, actually, nominally, or originally subject to a king or emperor. <i>He was the prince of a small kingdom that was now part of Pakistan.</i> |
| principality | A state ruled by a prince. |
| queen | Promote to a queen as of a pawn in chess. <i>She s the official carnival queen.</i> |
| regal | Belonging to or befitting a supreme ruler. <i>Regal attire.</i> |
| regency | The particular period of a regency especially in Britain from 1811 to 1820 and in France from 1715 to 1723. <i>The boy being a minor there would have to be a regency.</i> |

royal

Invested with royal power as symbolized by a crown.
*The **royal** or crowned heads of Europe.*

ruler

A person who rules or commands.

scepter

The imperial authority symbolized by a scepter.

sovereign

Not controlled by outside forces.
*A **sovereign** remedy for all ills.*

tyrannize

Rule or treat (someone) despotically or cruelly.
*He **tyrannizes** over the servants.*

vassal

A person holding a fief; a person who owes allegiance and service to a feudal lord.
*A **vassal** state of the Ottoman Empire.*
