## Synonyms of "Emphatically" as an adverb (26 Words)

<b>absolutely</b>	With no qualification, restriction, or limitation; totally. <i>She had <b>absolutely</b> no idea what he was talking about.</i>
<b>bitterly</b>	(relating to wind or weather) to an intensely cold degree. <i>The two governments quarrelled <b>bitterly</b> over the terms of the loan.</i>
<b>by all odds</b>	In reserve; not for immediate use.
<b><u>certainly</u></b>	Used to indicate that a statement is made as a concession or contrasted with another. <i>The prestigious address <b>certainly</b> adds to the firm's appeal.</i>
<b>clearly</b>	Without doubt; obviously. <i>On white paper the seeds are <b>clearly</b> visible.</i>
<b>decidedly</b>	Undoubtedly; undeniably. <i>He looked <b>decidedly</b> uncomfortable.</i>
<b>definitely</b>	Without doubt (used for emphasis). <i>I shall <b>definitely</b> be at the airport to meet you.</i>

<b>distinctly</b>	In a way that is readily distinguishable by the senses; clearly. <i>He looked <b>distinctly</b> uncomfortable.</i>
<b>downright</b>	Thoroughgoing. <i>He was <b>downright</b> rude.</i>
<b>expressly</b>	With specific intentions; for the express purpose. <i>The house was <b>expressly</b> built for entertaining.</i>
<b>fiercely</b>	In a physically fierce manner. <i>They fought <b>fiercely</b>.</i>
<b>forcefully</b>	In a strong and assertive manner; vigorously. <i>The government need to act <b>forcefully</b> on this issue.</i>
<b>in spades</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>indisputably</b>	In a way that cannot be challenged or denied. <i>What he said was <b>indisputably</b> true.</i>
<b>manifestly</b>	Unmistakably (‘plain’ is often used informally for ‘plainly’). <i>He was <b>manifestly</b> too important to leave off the guest list.</i>
<b>markedly</b>	In a clearly noticeable manner. <i>New diagnoses have increased <b>markedly</b> since 1998.</i>
<b>noticeably</b>	In a way that is easily seen or noticed; clearly. <i>After surgery she deteriorated <b>noticeably</b>.</i>
<b>obviously</b>	In a way that is easily perceived or understood; clearly. <i>She was <b>obviously</b> unwell.</i>
<b>patently</b>	Clearly; without doubt. <i>The Government’s approach had <b>patently</b> failed to address the problem.</i>
<b>positively</b>	In a positive way, especially by expressing optimism, agreement, or acceptance. <i>Some of the diets may be <b>positively</b> dangerous.</i>
<b>severely</b>	With sternness; in a severe manner. <i>Her hair was <b>severely</b> pulled back into a bun.</i>
<b>sharply</b>	With a sudden and marked change; dramatically. <i>The waitress had a <b>sharply</b> defined jaw.</i>
<b>undeniably</b>	Used to emphasize that something cannot be denied or disputed. <i>Effective responsive government <b>undeniably</b> benefits businesses.</i>
<b>unmistakably</b>	In a signal manner. <i>I saw her there clearly and <b>unmistakably</b>.</i>
<b>unquestionably</b>	In a way that cannot be disputed or doubted; without question. <i>Fred Winter is <b>unquestionably</b> the jockey to follow.</i>

**vehemently** In a forceful, passionate, or intense manner; with great feeling.  
*He **vehemently** denied any suggestion of improper conduct.*

- *Jane, though born in California, feels emphatically English.*
- *She closed the door behind her emphatically.*

<b>accent</b>	Put stress on utter with an accent. <i>A strong American <b>accent</b>.</i>
<b>accentuate</b>	Make more noticeable or prominent. <i>His jacket unfortunately <b>accentuated</b> his paunch.</i>
<b>decidedly</b>	In a decisive and confident way. <i>It was <b>decidedly</b> too expensive.</i>
<b>definitely</b>	Without doubt (used for emphasis). <i>We couldn't plan to go elsewhere until we had heard from you more <b>definitely</b>.</i>
<b>emphasis</b>	Special and significant stress by means of position or repetition e.g. <i>His <b>emphasis</b> on civil rights.</i>
<b>emphasize</b>	Make (something) more clearly defined. <i>His father <b>emphasized</b> the wrong words in his sentence.</i>
<b>emphasized</b>	Spoken with emphasis.
<b>emphatic</b>	An emphatic consonant. <i>The document contained a particularly <b>emphatic</b> guarantee of religious liberty.</i>
<b>floodlight</b>	The illumination provided by a floodlight. <i>A tennis court where you can play by <b>floodlight</b>.</i>
<b>focus</b>	Put an image into focus. <i>Try to <b>focus</b> on a stationary object.</i>
<b>focused</b>	(of light rays) converging on a point. <i>He seems to be very <b>focused</b> on the new challenge.</i>
<b>foreground</b>	Move into the foreground to make more visible or prominent. <i>Issues which have occupied the political <b>foreground</b> in recent years.</i>

<b>highlight</b>	Create highlights in hair. <i>A vast backdrop with the colourful logo <b>highlighted</b> with lasers.</i>
<b>importance</b>	A prominent status. <i>An issue of great <b>importance</b>.</i>
<b>instrumental</b>	The instrumental case. <i>The Society was <b>instrumental</b> in bringing about legislation.</i>
<b>intension</b>	The internal content of a concept.
<b>lilt</b>	Speak sing or sound with a lilt. <i>The <b>lilt</b> of the Hawaiian music.</i>
<b>limelight</b>	Intense white light obtained by heating lime, formerly used in theatres. <i>He enjoyed being in the <b>limelight</b>.</i>
<b>overburden</b>	Load (someone) with too many things to carry. <i>Ministers are <b>overburdened</b> with engagements.</i>
<b>significance</b>	The extent to which a result deviates from that expected to arise simply from random variation or errors in sampling. <i>Adolescent education was felt to be a social issue of some <b>significance</b>.</i>
<b>spotlight</b>	A beam of light projected from a spotlight. <i>She was constantly in the media <b>spotlight</b>.</i>
<b>strain</b>	Rub through a strainer or process in an electric blender. <i><b>Straining</b> our ears to hear.</i>
<b>stress</b>	The degree of stress measured in units of force per unit area. <i><b>Stress</b> is a vasoconstrictor.</i>
<b>stressed</b>	Strengthened by the application of stress during manufacture prestressed. <i>She should see a doctor if she is feeling particularly <b>stressed</b> out.</i>
<b>tend</b>	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. <i>Her hair <b>tended</b> to come loose.</i>
<b>tension</b>	A strained political or social state or relationship. <i>The parachute keeps the cable under <b>tension</b> as it drops.</i>
<b>underline</b>	Emphasize (something). <i>She has a white tail and <b>underline</b>.</i>
<b>underscore</b>	Emphasize. <i>The company <b>underscored</b> the progress made with fuel cells.</i>
<b>undoubtedly</b>	Without doubt; certainly. <i>It s <b>undoubtedly</b> very beautiful.</i>
<b>unquestionably</b>	Without question and beyond doubt. <i><b>Unquestionably</b> the loss of his father was a grievous blow.</i>
