New diagnoses have increased **markedly** since 1998.

After surgery she deteriorated **noticeably**.

**obviously**In a way that is easily perceived or understood; clearly.

She was **obviously** unwell.

patently Clearly; without doubt.

The Government's approach had **patently** failed to address the problem.

In a positive way, especially by expressing optimism, agreement, or

**positively** acceptance.

Some of the diets may be **positively** dangerous.

**severely** With sternness; in a severe manner.

Her hair was **severely** pulled back into a bun.

With a sudden and marked change; dramatically.

Used to emphasize that something cannot be denied or disputed.

vehemently

In a forceful, passionate, or intense manner; with great feeling. He **vehemently** denied any suggestion of improper conduct.
