absolutely	With no qualification, restriction, or limitation; totally. <i>She had absolutely no idea what he was talking about.</i>
bitterly	(relating to wind or weather) to an intensely cold degree. <i>The two governments quarrelled bitterly over the terms of the loan.</i>
by all odds	In reserve; not for immediate use.
<u>certainly</u>	Used to indicate that a statement is made as a concession or contrasted with another. <i>The prestigious address certainly adds to the firm's appeal.</i>
clearly	Without doubt; obviously. <i>On white paper the seeds are clearly visible.</i>
decidedly	Undoubtedly; undeniably. <i>He looked decidedly uncomfortable.</i>
definitely	Without doubt (used for emphasis). <i>I shall definitely be at the airport to meet you.</i>

distinctly	In a way that is readily distinguishable by the senses; clearly. <i>He looked distinctly uncomfortable.</i>
downright	Thoroughgoing. <i>He was downright rude.</i>
expressly	With specific intentions; for the express purpose. <i>The house was expressly built for entertaining.</i>
fiercely	In a physically fierce manner. <i>They fought fiercely.</i>
forcefully	In a strong and assertive manner; vigorously. <i>The government need to act forcefully on this issue.</i>
in spades	To or toward the inside of.
indisputably	In a way that cannot be challenged or denied. <i>What he said was indisputably true.</i>
manifestly	Unmistakably ('plain' is often used informally for 'plainly'). <i>He was manifestly too important to leave off the guest list.</i>
markedly	In a clearly noticeable manner. <i>New diagnoses have increased markedly since 1998.</i>
noticeably	In a way that is easily seen or noticed; clearly. <i>After surgery she deteriorated noticeably.</i>
obviously	In a way that is easily perceived or understood; clearly. <i>She was obviously unwell.</i>
patently	Clearly; without doubt. <i>The Government's approach had patently failed to address the problem.</i>
positively	In a positive way, especially by expressing optimism, agreement, or acceptance. <i>Some of the diets may be positively dangerous.</i>
severely	With sternness; in a severe manner. <i>Her hair was severely pulled back into a bun.</i>
sharply	With a sudden and marked change; dramatically. <i>The waitress had a sharply defined jaw.</i>
undeniably	Used to emphasize that something cannot be denied or disputed. <i>Effective responsive government undeniably benefits businesses.</i>
unmistakably	In a signal manner. <i>I saw her there clearly and unmistakably.</i>
unquestionably	In a way that cannot be disputed or doubted; without question. <i>Fred Winter is unquestionably the jockey to follow.</i>

vehemently In a forceful, passionate, or intense manner; with great feeling.
*He **vehemently** denied any suggestion of improper conduct.*

- *'No way,' he said emphatically.*
- *Jane, though born in California, feels emphatically English.*
- *She closed the door behind her emphatically.*

accent	Put stress on utter with an accent. <i>A strong American accent.</i>
accentuate	Make more noticeable or prominent. <i>His jacket unfortunately accentuated his paunch.</i>
decidedly	In a decisive and confident way. <i>It was decidedly too expensive.</i>
definitely	Without doubt (used for emphasis). <i>We couldn't plan to go elsewhere until we had heard from you more definitely.</i>
emphasis	Special and significant stress by means of position or repetition e.g. <i>His emphasis on civil rights.</i>
emphasize	Make (something) more clearly defined. <i>His father emphasized the wrong words in his sentence.</i>
emphasized	Spoken with emphasis.
emphatic	An emphatic consonant. <i>The document contained a particularly emphatic guarantee of religious liberty.</i>
floodlight	The illumination provided by a floodlight. <i>A tennis court where you can play by floodlight.</i>
focus	Put an image into focus. <i>Try to focus on a stationary object.</i>
focused	(of light rays) converging on a point. <i>He seems to be very focused on the new challenge.</i>
foreground	Move into the foreground to make more visible or prominent. <i>Issues which have occupied the political foreground in recent years.</i>

highlight	Create highlights in hair. <i>A vast backdrop with the colourful logo highlighted with lasers.</i>
importance	A prominent status. <i>An issue of great importance.</i>
instrumental	The instrumental case. <i>The Society was instrumental in bringing about legislation.</i>
intension	The internal content of a concept.
lilt	Speak sing or sound with a lilt. <i>The lilt of the Hawaiian music.</i>
limelight	Intense white light obtained by heating lime, formerly used in theatres. <i>He enjoyed being in the limelight.</i>
overburden	Load (someone) with too many things to carry. <i>Ministers are overburdened with engagements.</i>
significance	The extent to which a result deviates from that expected to arise simply from random variation or errors in sampling. <i>Adolescent education was felt to be a social issue of some significance.</i>
<u>spotlight</u>	A beam of light projected from a spotlight. <i>She was constantly in the media spotlight.</i>
strain	Rub through a strainer or process in an electric blender. <i>Straining our ears to hear.</i>
stress	The degree of stress measured in units of force per unit area. <i>Stress is a vasoconstrictor.</i>
stressed	Strengthened by the application of stress during manufacture prestressed. <i>She should see a doctor if she is feeling particularly stressed out.</i>
<u>tend</u>	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. <i>Her hair tended to come loose.</i>
tension	A strained political or social state or relationship. <i>The parachute keeps the cable under tension as it drops.</i>
<u>underline</u>	Emphasize (something). <i>She has a white tail and underline.</i>
<u>underscore</u>	Emphasize. <i>The company underscored the progress made with fuel cells.</i>
<u>undoubtedly</u>	Without doubt; certainly. <i>It s undoubtedly very beautiful.</i>
unquestionably	Without question and beyond doubt. <i>Unquestionably the loss of his father was a grievous blow.</i>
