- *An extensive sphere of activity controlled by one person or group.*
- *A group of countries under a single authority.*
- *An extensive group of states or countries ruled over by a single monarch, an oligarchy, or a sovereign state.*
- *The domain ruled by an emperor or empress; the region over which imperial dominion is exercised.*
- *Supreme political power over several countries when exercised by a single authority.*
- *A group of diverse companies under common ownership and run as a single organization.*
- *An eating apple that somewhat resembles a McIntosh; used as both an eating and a cooking apple.*
- *Absolute control over a person or group.*
- *A large commercial organization owned or controlled by one person or group.*
- *A monarchy with an emperor as head of state.*

business	Business concerns collectively. <i>He's not in my line of business.</i>
company	A social or business visitor. <i>He missed their company.</i>
conglomerate	A coarse-grained sedimentary rock composed of rounded fragments embedded in a matrix of cementing material such as silica. <i>The Earth is a specialized conglomerate of organisms.</i>
<u>consortium</u>	An association of companies for some definite purpose. <i>The amount awarded for loss of consortium must be included.</i>
corporation	A business firm whose articles of incorporation have been approved in some state. <i>Multinational corporations.</i>

domain	People in general; especially a distinctive group of people with some shared interest. <i>The French domains of the Plantagenets.</i>
establishment	A group in a society exercising power and influence over matters of policy, opinion, or taste, and seen as resisting change. <i>Hotels or catering establishments.</i>
firm	The members of a business organization that owns or operates one or more establishments.
imperium	Absolute power. <i>An outpost of their economic imperium.</i>
institution	The act of starting something for the first time; introducing something new. <i>A certificate from a professional institution.</i>
<u>kingdom</u>	The rule of God or Christ in a future age. <i>The kingdom of dreams.</i>
multinational	A company operating in several countries. <i>The oil industry was entirely controlled by five multinationals.</i>
operation	The performance of some composite cognitive activity an operation that affects mental contents. <i>Running a restaurant is quite an operation.</i>
organization	The persons (or committees or departments etc.) who make up a body for the purpose of administering something. <i>The facts were familiar but it was in the organization of them that he was original.</i>
<u>province</u>	Northern Ireland. <i>She knew little about wine that had been her father's province.</i>
<u>realm</u>	A field or domain of activity or interest. <i>An overall Labour majority is not beyond the realms of possibility.</i>
<u>territory</u>	An area defended by an animal or group of animals against others of the same sex or species. <i>Don't go committing murders on my territory.</i>

diadem	An ornamental jeweled headdress signifying sovereignty. <i>He refused the diadem of all the Caesars.</i>
<u>dynasty</u>	A line of hereditary rulers of a country. <i>The Tang dynasty.</i>
<u>emperor</u>	Large moth of temperate forests of Eurasia having heavily scaled transparent wings. <i>He is regarded as one of the greatest Roman emperors.</i>
enthrone	Install (a monarch or bishop) on a throne, especially during a ceremony to mark the beginning of their rule. <i>He was enthroned as the guru of the avant garde.</i>
<u>imperial</u>	Relating to an emperor. <i>Britain s imperial past.</i>
incan	Of or pertaining to the Incas or their culture or empire.
<u>king</u>	One of the four playing cards in a deck bearing the picture of a king. <i>A country where football is king.</i>
<u>kingdom</u>	The rule of God or Christ in a future age. <i>The kingdom of dreams.</i>
liege	A feudal lord entitled to allegiance and service. <i>The king s lieges.</i>
<u>lord</u>	Make a lord of someone. <i>When we were at school you used to lord it over us.</i>
monarchy	The monarch and royal family of a country. <i>The monarchy is the focus of loyalty and service.</i>
<u>palace</u>	The governing group of a kingdom. <i>The palace issued an order binding on all subjects.</i>
pharaoh	The title of the ancient Egyptian kings. <i>The time of the pharaohs.</i>
prince	A male member of a royal family other than the sovereign (especially the son of a sovereign). <i>Arctic char is a prince among fishes.</i>
princess	The daughter of a monarch. <i>The princess of American politics.</i>
principality	Wales.
queen	A playing card bearing a representation of a queen normally ranking next below a king and above a jack. <i>She s the official carnival queen.</i>

regal	Of, resembling, or fit for a monarch, especially in being magnificent or dignified. <i>Regal attire.</i>
regalia	The distinctive clothing worn and ornaments carried at formal occasions as an indication of status. <i>The Bishop of Florence in full regalia.</i>
regency	The particular period of a regency especially in Britain from 1811 to 1820 and in France from 1715 to 1723. <i>The boy being a minor there would have to be a regency.</i>
royal	Established or chartered or authorized by royalty. <i>The royal or crowned heads of Europe.</i>
ruler	Measuring stick consisting of a strip of wood or metal or plastic with a straight edge that is used for drawing straight lines and measuring lengths.
scepter	The imperial authority symbolized by a scepter.
sovereign	A supreme ruler, especially a monarch. <i>In modern democracies the people's will is in theory sovereign.</i>
tyrannize	Rule or treat (someone) despotically or cruelly. <i>She tyrannized her family.</i>
