### Definitions of "Empire" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “empire” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An extensive sphere of activity controlled by one person or group.*
- *A group of countries under a single authority.*
- *An extensive group of states or countries ruled over by a single monarch, an oligarchy, or a sovereign state.*
- *The domain ruled by an emperor or empress; the region over which imperial dominion is exercised.*
- *Supreme political power over several countries when exercised by a single authority.*
- *A group of diverse companies under common ownership and run as a single organization.*
- *An eating apple that somewhat resembles a McIntosh; used as both an eating and a cooking apple.*
- *Absolute control over a person or group.*
- *A large commercial organization owned or controlled by one person or group.*
- *A monarchy with an emperor as head of state.*

- corporation** A business firm whose articles of incorporation have been approved in some state.  
*Multinational **corporations**.*

<b>domain</b>	People in general; especially a distinctive group of people with some shared interest. <i>The French <b>domains</b> of the Plantagenets.</i>
<b>establishment</b>	A group in a society exercising power and influence over matters of policy, opinion, or taste, and seen as resisting change. <i>Hotels or catering <b>establishments</b>.</i>
<b>firm</b>	The members of a business organization that owns or operates one or more establishments.
<b>imperium</b>	Absolute power. <i>An outpost of their economic <b>imperium</b>.</i>
<b>institution</b>	The act of starting something for the first time; introducing something new. <i>A certificate from a professional <b>institution</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">kingdom</a></u>	The rule of God or Christ in a future age. <i>The <b>kingdom</b> of dreams.</i>
<b>multinational</b>	A company operating in several countries. <i>The oil industry was entirely controlled by five <b>multinationals</b>.</i>
<b>operation</b>	The performance of some composite cognitive activity an operation that affects mental contents. <i>Running a restaurant is quite an <b>operation</b>.</i>
<b>organization</b>	The persons (or committees or departments etc.) who make up a body for the purpose of administering something. <i>The facts were familiar but it was in the <b>organization</b> of them that he was original.</i>
<u><a href="#">province</a></u>	Northern Ireland. <i>She knew little about wine that had been her father's <b>province</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">realm</a></u>	A field or domain of activity or interest. <i>An overall Labour majority is not beyond the <b>realms</b> of possibility.</i>
<u><a href="#">territory</a></u>	An area defended by an animal or group of animals against others of the same sex or species. <i>Don't go committing murders on my <b>territory</b>.</i>

- ancient** A person who lived in ancient times.  
*A solitary **ancient** in a tweed jacket.*
- baton** A short staff carried by some officials to symbolize an office or an authority.

- byzantine** Of or relating to or characteristic of the Byzantine Empire or the ancient city of Byzantium.
- castle** A large building, typically of the medieval period, fortified against attack with thick walls, battlements, towers, and in many cases a moat.

- crown** Ceremonially place a crown on the head of someone in order to invest them as a monarch.  
*Shiny covers embossed with gold **crowns**.*

<b>diadem</b>	An ornamental jeweled headdress signifying sovereignty. <i>He refused the <b>diadem</b> of all the Caesars.</i>
<b><u>dynasty</u></b>	A line of hereditary rulers of a country. <i>The Tang <b>dynasty</b>.</i>
<b><u>emperor</u></b>	Large moth of temperate forests of Eurasia having heavily scaled transparent wings. <i>He is regarded as one of the greatest Roman <b>emperors</b>.</i>
<b>enthrone</b>	Install (a monarch or bishop) on a throne, especially during a ceremony to mark the beginning of their rule. <i>He was <b>enthroned</b> as the guru of the avant garde.</i>
<b><u>imperial</u></b>	Relating to an emperor. <i>Britain s <b>imperial</b> past.</i>
<b>incan</b>	Of or pertaining to the Incas or their culture or empire.
<b><u>king</u></b>	One of the four playing cards in a deck bearing the picture of a king. <i>A country where football is <b>king</b>.</i>
<b><u>kingdom</u></b>	The rule of God or Christ in a future age. <i>The <b>kingdom</b> of dreams.</i>
<b>liege</b>	A feudal lord entitled to allegiance and service. <i>The king s <b>lieges</b>.</i>
<b><u>lord</u></b>	Make a lord of someone. <i>When we were at school you used to <b>lord</b> it over us.</i>
<b>monarchy</b>	The monarch and royal family of a country. <i>The <b>monarchy</b> is the focus of loyalty and service.</i>
<b><u>palace</u></b>	The governing group of a kingdom. <i>The <b>palace</b> issued an order binding on all subjects.</i>
<b>pharaoh</b>	The title of the ancient Egyptian kings. <i>The time of the <b>pharaohs</b>.</i>
<b>prince</b>	A male member of a royal family other than the sovereign (especially the son of a sovereign). <i>Arctic char is a <b>prince</b> among fishes.</i>
<b>princess</b>	The daughter of a monarch. <i>The <b>princess</b> of American politics.</i>
<b>principality</b>	Wales.
<b>queen</b>	A playing card bearing a representation of a queen normally ranking next below a king and above a jack. <i>She s the official carnival <b>queen</b>.</i>

<b>regal</b>	Of, resembling, or fit for a monarch, especially in being magnificent or dignified. <i><b>Regal</b> attire.</i>
<b>regalia</b>	The distinctive clothing worn and ornaments carried at formal occasions as an indication of status. <i>The Bishop of Florence in full <b>regalia</b>.</i>
<b>regency</b>	The particular period of a regency especially in Britain from 1811 to 1820 and in France from 1715 to 1723. <i>The boy being a minor there would have to be a <b>regency</b>.</i>
<b>royal</b>	Established or chartered or authorized by royalty. <i>The <b>royal</b> or crowned heads of Europe.</i>
<b>ruler</b>	Measuring stick consisting of a strip of wood or metal or plastic with a straight edge that is used for drawing straight lines and measuring lengths.
<b>scepter</b>	The imperial authority symbolized by a scepter.
<b>sovereign</b>	A supreme ruler, especially a monarch. <i>In modern democracies the people's will is in theory <b>sovereign</b>.</i>
<b>tyrannize</b>	Rule or treat (someone) despotically or cruelly. <i>She <b>tyrannized</b> her family.</i>
