- An extensive group of states or countries ruled over by a single monarch, an oligarchy, or a sovereign state.
- The domain ruled by an emperor or empress; the region over which imperial dominion is exercised.
- Supreme political power over several countries when exercised by a single authority.
- A group of diverse companies under common ownership and run as a single organization.
- An eating apple that somewhat resembles a McIntosh; used as both an eating and a cooking apple.
- Absolute control over a person or group.
- A large commercial organization owned or controlled by one person or group.
- A monarchy with an emperor as head of state.
