### **Definitions of "Employer" as a noun**

- *A person or firm that employs workers.*
- *A person or organization that employs people.*



## Synonyms of "Employer" as a noun (16 Words)

<b>boss</b>	A person who exercises control over workers. <i>The <b>boss</b> characters provide more than enough challenge.</i>
<b>business</b>	Business concerns collectively. <i>Gossip was the main <b>business</b> of the evening.</i>
<b>chief executive</b>	The head of a tribe or clan.
<b>company</b>	The fact or condition of being with another or others, especially in a way that provides friendship and enjoyment. <i>A hook and ladder <b>company</b>.</i>
<b>director</b>	Member of a board of directors. <i>The sales <b>director</b>.</i>
<b>firm</b>	The members of a business organization that owns or operates one or more establishments.
<b>head man</b>	A rounded compact mass.

<b>head woman</b>	The tip of an abscess (where the pus accumulates).
<b>manager</b>	A person regarded in terms of their skill in managing resources, especially those of a household. <i>She was a good <b>manager</b> and could make a meal out of nothing.</i>
<b>manageress</b>	A female manager of a shop, restaurant, etc.
<b>manufacturer</b>	A person or company that makes goods for sale. <i>The <b>manufacturers</b> supply the goods to the distribution centre.</i>
<b>organization</b>	The act of organizing a business or an activity related to a business. <i>He was brought in to supervise the <b>organization</b> of a new department.</i>
<b>patron</b>	A person who gives financial or other support to a person, organization, or cause. <i>A celebrated <b>patron</b> of the arts.</i>
<b><u>president</u></b>	The officer who presides at the meetings of an organization. <i>The Irish <b>president</b>.</i>
<b>principal</b>	An actor who plays a principal role. <i>The winners are paid from the interest without even touching the <b>principal</b>.</i>
<b><u>proprietor</u></b>	The owner of a business, or a holder of property. <i>By 1640 he was himself the <b>proprietor</b> of a three hundred acre tract.</i>





## Usage Examples of "Employer" as a noun

- *The National Health Service was the largest employer in Europe.*



## Associations of "Employer" (30 Words)

<b>accountant</b>	A person whose job is to keep, inspect, and analyse financial accounts.
<b>administrator</b>	A person legally appointed to manage and dispose of the estate of a deceased person, debtor, or insolvent company. <i>Hospital <b>administrators</b>.</i>
<b>assistant</b>	A person who ranks below a senior person. <i>An <b>assistant</b> manager.</i>
<b>bailiff</b>	The agent of a landlord.
<b>bookkeeper</b>	A person whose job is to keep records of the financial affairs of a business. <i>The business had grown enough to justify hiring a <b>bookkeeper</b>.</i>
<b>boss</b>	Raise in a relief. <i>That was a real <b>boss</b> move on his part.</i>
<b><u>captain</u></b>	Be the captain of a ship aircraft or sports team. <i>He did very well academically becoming school <b>captain</b>.</i>

<b>chief</b>	A leader or ruler of a people or clan. <i>It s quite simple <b>chief</b>.</i>
<b>clerk</b>	Work as a clerk as in the legal business. <i>A <b>clerk</b> to the magistrates.</i>
<b>controller</b>	Someone who maintains and audits business accounts. <i>The speed <b>controller</b> on his turntable was not working properly.</i>
<b>coordinator</b>	A word used to connect clauses, sentences, or words of equal syntactic importance (e.g. and, or, for). <i>Subordinate clauses can be connected with a <b>coordinator</b>.</i>
<b>doctoral</b>	Relating to or designed to achieve a doctorate. <i><b>Doctoral</b> dissertation.</i>
<a href="#"><u>employ</u></a>	Employment. <i>I started work in the <b>employ</b> of a grocer.</i>
<b>employed</b>	Put to use. <i>Up to 40 per cent of <b>employed</b> people are in part time jobs.</i>
<b>employment</b>	The act of using. <i>He is looking for <b>employment</b>.</i>
<b>foreman</b>	(in a law court) a person who presides over a jury and speaks on its behalf. <i>If you want to leave early you have to ask the <b>foreman</b>.</i>
<b>headhunter</b>	A person who identifies and approaches suitable candidates employed elsewhere to fill business positions. <i>A <b>headhunter</b> offering you a wonderful new position at a higher salary.</i>
<b>hire</b>	A person who is hired an employee. <i>We flew to San Diego <b>hired</b> a car and headed for Las Vegas.</i>
<b>manager</b>	Someone who controls resources and expenditures. <i>If I was his <b>manager</b> I would offer Lewis 8 m for the fight.</i>
<b>organizer</b>	A person who brings order and organization to an enterprise. <i>The <b>organizers</b> of the demonstration.</i>
<a href="#"><u>overseer</u></a>	A person who directs and manages an organization.
<b>producer</b>	Someone who finds financing for and supervises the making and presentation of a show (play or film or program or similar work). <i>This microorganism is a <b>producer</b> of disease.</i>
<b>recruiter</b>	An official who enlists personnel for military service. <i>A <b>recruiter</b> will schedule you for an interview.</i>
<a href="#"><u>secretary</u></a>	An official in charge of a US government department. <i>She was <b>secretary</b> of the Women s Labour League.</i>



- storekeeper** A person responsible for stored goods.
- superintendent** The caretaker of a building.  
***Superintendent** of district nurses.*
- supervise** Observe and direct the work of (someone).  
*The prisoners were **supervised** by two officers.*
- supervisor** A person who supervises a person or an activity.
- union** A device on a national flag emblematic of the union of two or more sovereignties typically in the upper inner corner.  
*A **union** shop clause in the contract.*
- wage** The result or effect of doing something considered wrong or unwise.  
*We were struggling to get better **wages**.*
